"Secondly, Mephibosheth was treated as a son by David, as David had once been treated by Saul. It is hard not to see these links back to Saul as deliberate. David, in welcoming Mephibosheth, is imitating Saul's good points and in not treating Mephibosheth as a threat but gladly giving him back his ancestral lands, is avoiding imitating Saul's bad points. The reader is being drawn towards the conclusion that, perhaps unlike Saul, David really was a worthy king..."

2. His Obligation

- a. <u>1 Samuel 20:13–15</u> "13 … if it please my father to do thee evil, then I will shew it thee, and send thee away, that thou mayest go in peace: and the Lord be with thee, as he hath been with my father. 14
 <u>And thou shalt not only while yet I live shew me the kindness of the Lord</u>, that I die not: 15 But also <u>thou shalt not cut off thy kindness from my house for ever</u>: no, not when the Lord hath cut off the enemies of David every one from the face of the earth."
- b. <u>1 Samuel 20:16</u> "16 <u>So Jonathan made a covenant with the house of David</u>, saying, Let the Lord even require it at the hand of David's enemies."

A HUMBLE SERVANT

1. THE CRIPELED CONDITION

- a. LAME- <u>2 Samuel 9:3</u> "3 And the king said, Is there not yet any of the house of Saul, that I may shew the kindness of God unto him? And Ziba said unto the king, Jonathan hath yet a son, which is lame on his feet."
- b. LEFT- <u>2 Samuel 9:1</u> "1 And David said, Is there yet any that is left of the house of Saul, that I may shew him kindness for Jonathan's sake?"
- c. LODEDAR- <u>2 Samuel 9:4</u> "4 And the king said unto him, Where is he? And Ziba said unto the king, Behold, he is in the house of Machir, the son of Ammiel, in Lo-debar."

2. THE KING'S CALL

- a. INITIATION- <u>2 Samuel 9:5</u> "5 Then king David sent, and fetched him out of the house of Machir, the son of Ammiel, from Lo-debar."
- b. INTIMIDATION- <u>2 Samuel 9:6</u> "6 Now when Mephibosheth, the son of Jonathan, the son of Saul, was come unto David, he fell on his face, and did reverence. And David said, Mephibosheth. And he answered, Behold thy servant!"

- a. THE REASONING <u>2 Samuel 9:7</u> "7 And David said unto him, Fear not: for I will surely <u>shew thee kindness for Jonathan thy father's sake</u>, and will restore thee all the land of Saul thy father; and thou shalt eat bread at my table continually."
- b. THE RESTORATION <u>2 Samuel 9:7</u> "7 And David said unto him, Fear not: for I will surely shew thee kindness for Jonathan thy father's sake, and <u>will restore</u> <u>thee all the land of Saul thy father</u>; and thou shalt eat bread at my table continually."
- c. THE REWARD <u>2 Samuel 9:7</u> "7 And David said unto him, Fear not: for I will surely shew thee kindness for Jonathan thy father's sake, and will restore thee all the land of Saul thy father; and <u>thou shalt eat bread at my table continually</u>."
- d. THE RECRUITMENT- <u>2 Samuel 9:9–10</u> "9 <u>Then the king called to Ziba, Saul's servant</u>, and said unto him, I have given unto thy master's son all that pertained to Saul and to all his house. 10 <u>Thou therefore, and thy sons, and thy servants, shall till the land for him</u>, and thou shalt bring in the fruits, that thy master's son may have food to eat: but Mephibosheth thy master's son shall eat bread alway at my table. Now Ziba had fifteen sons and twenty servants."
- e. The REMOVAL- <u>2 Samuel 21:7</u> "7 But the king spared Mephibosheth, the son of Jonathan the son of Saul, because of the Lord's oath that was between them, between David and Jonathan the son of Saul."
- f. THE RESPONSE- <u>2 Samuel 9:12</u> "12 And Mephibosheth had a young son, whose name was Micha. And all that dwelt in the house of Ziba were servants unto Mephibosheth."
