How to Use This Guide in a Group Setting

Group Participants: Review your notes from the message and ask the Holy Spirit to continue to speak to you about your life. Come to eGroup prepared to participate. Watch the message online if you missed it live.

Group Leaders: Give everyone the chance to share, focusing on the questions that connect most with your group. Don't feel you must answer every question. If someone missed the message, allow time for others to fill them in on the main points and highlights.

Getting Started

Describe the best financial investment you've ever made, and why?

What risks and benefits were involved in making this investment?

In general, what's your approach to investing?

Embrace the Gospel

In our eGroup discussion guides, we're utilizing a simple structure for studying the Bible together, based on the acronym S.O.A.P. ...

Spirit: *Invite The Holy Spirit To Speak To You and To Guide Your Discussion*

Begin by praying and inviting the Spirit's activity into your discussion and application of God's Word.

Observation: *What Does This Passage Say?*

Read Luke 19:11-27 aloud two times, in a couple of different Bible translations, if possible.

As you're interacting with these verses, what observations stand out to you, intrigue you, or create some curiosity for you (words, phrases, concepts, interactions, etc.)?

What insights from Pastor Alan's message especially resonated with you or helped you better understand these verses?

What does this parable teach us about our responsibility as servants of a king?

How and where do minas get multiplied?

How does the servants' perception of the king impact their responses?

Embrace the Gospel Continued

What do you think about the king's response to the servant who kept the mina in a cloth?

Application: *What Is God Saying To Us/Me?*

What minas do you have that you believe are being used to advance God's kingdom?

What minas do you have that aren't being fully used or used at all right now? Why is that?

What is God saying to you in this week's message and eGroup discussion?

In response, what next step is God asking you to take?

How can your eGroup be praying for you and supporting you in this?

Experience the Spirit

Prayer: *Ask For God's Help In Living Out His Word*

As you pray for one another this week, begin by praying for peoples' responses to this week's message and eGroup discussion.

When you're done, spend time praying for general needs and concerns for one another.

Engage in Mission

It's our desire that every individual and eGroup at Christ Community make a difference by compassionately moving outward toward people who are lost, needy, and broken, demonstrating the love of Jesus in highly relational ways. They are currently looking for volunteers to help out with both the pre-k and elementary school kids on a weekly basis for the summer session spanning from May 14th-August 2nd.
