What's the most unique vacation you've ever taken?

While there, what did you do to make the most of this experience?

Group Interaction & Application

Read aloud Ephesians 3:17-19 a couple of times, in different Bible translations if possible. What strikes you or intrigues you the most from these verses ... words, phrases, concepts, or other things?

What stood out to you the most from this weekend's message on these verses by Pastor Alan?

How would you summarize the main point of his message? What was the message's primary take-away for you, and why?

In his message, Pastor Alan said he believes that God's love is THE defining characteristic of what God is like (Ephesians 3:19; 1 John 4:8), and the more we experience God's love the more we experience the fullness of God Himself.

Do you tend to agree or disagree with this, and why?

Regardless of your answer, what are the implications of saying "God is love" vs. "God is loving?"

As believers, what does it mean, therefore, that we are "rooted and established" in God's love at the point of salvation? (verse 17)

What do the words "wide, long, high, and deep" communicate about the nature of God's love? (verse 18)

Where do you struggle in "knowing" or "grasping" a love like this? (verses 18 & 19)

Do you believe there are any limits or exceptions to God's love? Explain.

Considering this, do you have any difficulty expressing God's love to someone (or particular group of people), or experiencing God's love yourself?

What's the greatest challenge for you in expressing or experiencing God's vast and limitless love?

Where do you long to allow God to love you more fully right now? How can your group be praying for you and supporting you in making this a reality?
