Key Scriptures

For we have great joy and consolation in thy love, because the bowels of the saints are refreshed by thee, brother. Wherefore, though I might be much bold in Christ to enjoin thee that which is convenient ... Philemon 1:7-8 KJV

Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother, to Philemon our dear friend and fellow worker ... and to the church that meets in your home ... Philemon 1:1-2 NIV

How to Study the Bible

- Choose a translation you understand.
- 2. Choose a time, a place, and a plan to study.
- 3. Understand the context.
- 4. Read slowly and ask questions.
- 5. Pray for God to speak to you, and apply what He shows you.

Start talking. Find a conversation starter for your group.

What's something you enjoy learning about?

Start thinking. Ask a question to get your group thinking.

- Which part of this message was most impactful for you and why? Is there anything you want to learn more about?
- When you study the Bible, it's important to choose a time, a place, and a plan. What time, place, and plan do you think might work best for you?
- Read Philemon 1:4-5, 7-11. What was the context of this
 passage—what was going on with Paul and Onesimus when it
 was written? How does this information help you understand
 the significance of this letter?

Start sharing. Choose a question to create openness.

- God is writing our stories right now. How have you seen God use His Word to change your life?
- How is God calling you to go deeper in the Bible this week?

Start praying. Be bold and pray with power.

Father, thank You for giving us Your Word through the Bible. We want to use the Bible to get to know You better. Please help us and guide us as we continue studying Your Word. We're ready to know You more. In Jesus' name, amen.

Start doing. Commit to a step and live it out this week.
