We can treat people either <u>naturally</u> or <u>supernaturally</u>
 How you treat me is how I <u>treat</u> you. I treat people the way <u>God</u> treats me.
Option #1 – <u>Evil</u> and <u>Hatred</u> <u>Hatred</u> is an old problem.
God cares what's in your <u>hand</u> as well as your <u>heart</u> .
Don't be surprised if the world <u>hates</u> you.
Cain is a picture of <u>the world</u> . Abel is a picture of <u>godliness</u> .
Love is both a <u>mark</u> and a <u>test</u> for a Christian. Murder is the offspring of hatred.
Anger rises when we allow our <u>hurt</u> to turn into hate.
Option #2 - <u>Apathy</u>
Love is not <u>indifferent</u> . Love <u>gives</u> .
Love = time + talents + treasure + thoughts

Option #3 - <u>Love</u>
The point is not to <u>like</u> everyone.
The point is not to <u>trust</u> everyone.
The point is not to <u>be</u> <u>friends</u> with everyone. (Jesus was <u>friendly</u> to all
and <u>friends</u> with a few.)
Love <u>acts</u> .
