Chapter 19:1, 3, 6 - Hallelujah, Hallelujah, Hallelujah!

19:1 “Salvation” should be read as deliverance or triumph_____ (12:10).

Babylon = Rome and the world system_____.

19:2 God’s judgments come for repentance_____ or for vindication_____.

God sends judgments to stop_____ oppression or to avenge_____ it.

19:3-7 Worship of God and the joy of the Lord are experienced because:

1. promise of vindication for the righteous.
2. God reigns sovereignly.
3. intimacy with God.

19:9 The wedding supper of the Lamb.

There are great parallels with this and the Jewish wedding traditions (Matt 25).

Bride and groom are engaged, but the groom is a long time coming.

Groom goes to build a house – Jesus prepares a place for us.

Groom could come at any time for the bride – his coming is imminent.

Some of the bride’s attendants are ready, some are not.

The wedding and banquet take place and the doors are sealed.

19:10 Worship God!

We are empowered by the Spirit to speak_____ for God.

19:11-21 The Final Battle where Jesus conquers The beast, the false prophet and the kings of the earth_____.

We see Jesus as the divine warrior.

He is: Faithful and True (1:5, 2:10, 13)
Judges and makes war (11:7, 12:17, 13:7)

19:15 The sharp sword coming out of Jesus' mouth is the Word of God.

19:17 The great supper of God.

- The saints will partake of a banquet (Marriage supper of the Lamb)
- The wicked will be the banquet for invited birds.

Holy War

Jesus himself will destroy the enemies by his own sword.
