Observations:

- Denial is common to us all It is an unwillingness to <u>see ourselves</u> as we really are.
- The greater the denial the greater the <u>unfinished business</u>
- Key word for denial: <u>Rationalization</u>

In extreme cases there are two groups involved: <u>perpetrators</u> and <u>victims</u>.

- 4. <u>Manipulation</u>

- 5. <u>Selective</u> listening
- 6. <u>Critical</u> spirit
- 7. <u>Hardened</u> heart

- 2. Ask God to help you <u>find yourself</u> (verse 23).
- 3. Receive God's <u>cleansing</u>
