Scriptural Analysis of Jealousy – 1 Samuel 18

7 Characteristics of Jealousy

1. Anger
2. Suspicion
3. Easily slighted
4. Filled with fear
5. Rejoices in other's failures
6. Difficulty keeping promises
7. Irrational desire for control
