GETTING TO KNOW YOU:

1. What's the worst storm you've been in? Tornado? Hurricane? Earthquake? or _____? What happened?

RECAP:

We all face storms. It's not if or when storms will come, but how will we respond to them when they do come? On Sunday, Brett shared a message, "Are We There Yet?" He used two different storm stories from the book of Mark to encourage us that Jesus is with us in the midst of our storm. In Mark 4, Jesus spoke to the storm and it was completely calmed. In Mark 6, Jesus climbed into the boat with the disciples and the storm stopped.

4. How do you feel about Jesus knowing that "even the wind and the waves obey him?" Explain.
