Romans: The Power of the Gospel Hope (The Gospel Transforms) February 15, 2017 Romans 5:1-11

The central theme is: The power inherent in the Gospel.
Gospel = euongelion - good news (eu – good; angelion – message)
The Gospel is not good <u>advice</u> , it is Good <u>News</u> .
Our response to the inevitable sufferings of life takes two basic forms:
- <u>Epicureanism</u>
This particular response to suffering is calledqualified hedonism
- <u>Stoicism</u>
It means we see our suffering in the <u>context</u> of our future.
1. We <u>glory</u> in suffering to bring God <u>glory</u> .
2. Suffering is <u>productive</u> for us <u>personally</u> . (v.3-4)
It produces
The Greek word here literally means, "to remain firm under pressure"
It produces
Suffering produces <u>hope</u> .
