Recap:

Of all the Psalms, which do you think is the one most people would be able to quote from memory? The answer is probably Psalm 23, "The Lord is my shepherd...".

God is with us. We can trust Him and we have nothing to fear. Life maturity and spiritual growth can take place as we increasingly understand that, no matter what circumstance we walk through, God will come through. That is the very issue the writer of this Psalm is communicating.

- 6. Psalm 23:6 says that God's goodness and love is following you and tracking you downnot troubles, not calamity and not your past. How does knowing that truth help you to trust the outcomes to God? Explain.
