- 1. We learn that what John began, Jesus finished. What John prepared, Jesus fulfilled.
- 2. God was showing His approval of Jesus in a dramatic way.
- 3. Jesus experienced temptation as all men do.
- 4. Doing what pleases God, as Jesus did when He was baptized, does not exempt one from temptation.
- 5. The Holy Spirit came on Him in a form like a dove.
- 6. A voice spoke from Heaven saying, "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well-pleased."
- 7. Clearly these men recognized Jesus' greatness.
- 8. These fishermen demonstrated the meaning of discipleship. When Jesus called, they: 1) acted immediately, 2) left both job and family, and 3) started following Him.
- 9. Christ calls today through His Word. When we perceive His greatness, we need to obey immediately all He says and put Him ahead of everything, including our job and family, and follow Him, allowing His example to direct every step.
- 10. Competence: Jesus took responsibility to make them fishers of men.
- 11. Comprehension: He had a thorough understanding of the scriptures.
- 12. Command: He had authority and command of every situation.
- 13. Compassion: He served and healed the pain of others.
- 14. Control: He maintained organization and control in messy situations.
- 15. Communion: He stayed renewed by connecting to the Source of His Power.

- 16. All disobedience, even well-intentioned, hurts Jesus' work.
- 17. We should respond to His greatness by immediately obeying everything He says no matter what sacrifice is required.
- 18. Respect the authority of His message.
- 19. Obey Him even when His command seems unreasonable.
