

A Life of Wholeness, Part Two Anja Staten "Love Listens" 9/4/2022

Key Verses: Philippians 2:1-11

Key Thought: We can learn the fullness of what it means to listen from Jesus, who— in love— emptied himself and entered into our world as a servant.

Points to Consider:

- To listen is to love; the two are almost inseparable.
- "Emptying" refers to giving up divine privileges.
- Jesus became a slave ($\delta \circ \tilde{u} \lambda \circ \varsigma$) in that he lived for others.
- Verse 6-7 might be more aptly translated, "because being in very nature God... he emptied himself." The implication would be that emptying is a revelation of God's nature (as opposed to a contradiction).
- The life and death of Jesus was an act of love for us.
- Listening Tips:
 - i. H.U.T. (Heard, Understood, Taken Seriously)
 - ii. Closed Questions (i.e., Yes/No) → Open Questions
 - iii. Shift Response → Support Response
 - iv. Ask if there is more...

Discussion Questions:

- Who's an exceptional listener? How do they make you feel?
- How do Paul's commands in verses 3-4 relate to listening?
- What can we learn about listening from the life and death of Jesus?
- What are some reasons why is it so hard to listen?
- Where do you need to grow as a listener?
- Who in your life most needs your love through listening?
