Text: Acts 6:1-8

## TRUTH BIBLE CHURCH LOVING GOD - SERVING PEOPLE - PROCLAIMING GOOD NEWS

#### 1. Introduction:

- 2. Chad's Literal Translation Acts 6:1-8 Now in these days the disciples were multiplying (and) there became grumbling (from) the Hellenists towards the Hebrews because their widows were overlooked in the daily service. But the twelve having summoned the multitude of the disciples they said "It is not desirable for us having left the word of the God to serve tables. But you all shall see to it brothers men from out of you all testifying seven full of the spirit and wisdom which we will set over the need of these. But we will continue (in) the prayer and the service of the Word. And the word pleased before/with everyone of the multitude and they chose Stephen a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, and Philip, and Prochorus, and Nicanor, and Timon, and Parmenas and Nicolas, a proselyte from Antioch, which causing to stand before the Apostles and having prayed they laid on them the hands. And the Word of God grew and multiplied greatly the number of the disciples in Jerusalem. (And) many from the crowd of the priests became obedient (to) the faith. But Stephen was full of grace and grower and was doing wonders and great signs among the people.
- 3. Sermon Outline: Acts 6:1-8 teaches us 7 Biblical Principles regarding:
  - 1. How to biblically handle **complaints** in the church (conflict resolution/problem solving/reconciliation of relationships)
  - 2. How to biblically **lead** the church (Biblical roles of Elders and Deacons and the Members of the Congregation)
  - 3. How to biblically take care of the physical needs of our people (benevolence/practically helping and encouraging others)
  - 4. How to biblically **select** new church leaders (prototype Deacons)
  - 5. How to biblically **grow** as a church (God's Will for Church Growth)
  - 6. How to biblically **reach** even the most resistant people (religious but not saved)
  - 7. How to biblically **serve and imitate** godly & powerful men (Ex. Stephen)

#### 4. Main Points Expanded:

1. How to biblically handle **complaints** in the church (conflict resolution/problem solving)

**Acts 6:1** Now at this time while the disciples were increasing *in number*, a complaint arose on the part of the Hellenistic *Jews* against the *native* Hebrews, because their widows were being overlooked in the daily serving *of food*.

Complaint - γογγυσμός goggusmos: a muttering, murmuring (root: γογγύζω gogguzo: to mutter, murmur)

Verses with this word: Exodus 16:7 -9, 12; Numbers 17:20, 25; Ps. Sol. 5:13; 16:11; Isaiah 58:9; John 7:12; Acts 6:1; \*Philippians 2:14; 1 \*Peter 4:9

- Philippians 2:14 -16 <sup>14</sup> Do all things without grumbling or disputing; <sup>15</sup> so that you will prove yourselves to be blameless and innocent, children of God above reproach in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you appear as lights in the world, <sup>16</sup> holding fast the word of life...
- 1 Peter 4:9 9 Be hospitable to one another without complaint.
- a. Colossians 3 it—if preference/non-sin issues...<u>overlook it</u> with grace, forbearance, and love (love covers over/protects not exposes—Prov. 10:12, 1 Peter 4:8)

**Colossians 3:12-14** <sup>12</sup> So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience; <sup>13</sup> bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you. <sup>14</sup> Beyond all these things *put on* love, which is the perfect bond of unity.

b. **Matthew 5-7 it** – no matter if a preference or sin issue... **pray about it** and first examine your own heart, motives, and actions from God's perspective and from the other person's viewpoint, but always with a humble attitude to forgive as the Lord has already forgiven us.

Matthew 5:44 44 "But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you,

**Matthew 6:12-15** Pray in this way...<sup>12</sup> 'And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. <sup>13</sup> 'And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen .' <sup>14</sup> "For if you forgive others for their transgressions, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. <sup>15</sup> "But if you do not forgive others, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions.

c. Romans 12 it—if continues to hinder the relationship - <u>address it</u> by going to the person one to one/privately *before*/without talking about the person or the problem with others in order to pursue the highest level of reconciliation possible by seeking clarification, talking out any miscommunication, and working out any misunderstandings. \*\*\*Keep the circle of the problem as small as possible (who is part of the problem and the solution)

Romans 12:10 -18 <sup>10</sup> Be devoted to one another in brotherly love; give preference to one another in honor; <sup>11</sup> not lagging behind in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; <sup>12</sup> rejoicing in hope, persevering in tribulation, devoted to prayer, <sup>13</sup> contributing to the needs of the saints, practicing hospitality. <sup>14</sup> Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse. <sup>15</sup> Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep. <sup>16</sup> Be of the same mind toward one another; do not be haughty in mind, but associate with the lowly. Do not be wise in your own estimation. <sup>17</sup> Never pay back evil for evil to anyone Respect what is right in the sight of all men. <sup>18</sup> If possible, so far as it depends on you, be at peace with all men.

- **d.** Acts 6 it if it's a church problem that is hurting the church or those in the church but not necessarily a sin issue by an individual <u>let the Elders know about it</u> (take any complaints or problems in the church to the Elders so they can address and solve the problem or work on the weakness)
- · The Elders should address and fix any problems quickly, in a timely matter
- The Elders obviously met and reached unanimity in how to address and fix the problem (notice they did not
  ignore, deny or downplay the problem but acknowledged it and quickly worked to fix it)
- The Elders involved/consulted the entire congregation for their collective wisdom in order to arrive at the best solution
- The Elders delegated the action phase to others, the work/service to godly/spiritual men not only to bring
  about the best solution for the church but also to protect their service/ministry/calling to prioritize prayer and
  the teaching of the Word
- The delegated authority of the Elders was bestowed only after Elders prayed and established specific SPIRITUAL qualifications/criteria (Ex. Titus 1 / 1 Tim. 3)
- The Elders have the final authority in the church as the decision makers of the church by selecting seven
  prototype deacons by the laying on of their hands

  - Go 1 to 1 to seek their repentance and restoration (protect their reputation)
  - Confirm with 2 or 3 witnesses to seek their repentance and restoration  $\mbox{\ \ }\mbox{\ \ }\m$
  - Tell it to the church in order for the weight/power of the entire church to urgently call them to repentance with motivation of restoration not repudiation
  - Remove them from the church (protect the reputation/holiness of the church) and evangelize them as an unbeliever







## Chad: 7 dangers of Continuationism is:

- Distortion Distortion of God's Word most often Personal Experience is placed over or equal to the Word of God. They are often feelings and experience driven rather than truth/Bible driven as they don't practice consistent

hermeneutics (principles of bible interpretation). How do they know their dream, voice, or prophecy is from God and not from Satan or just from their own flesh that seeks to be seen as important or recognized by other believers? This allows for "new ideas" "new revelation" which is a modern day Gnosticism (secret knowledge that is superior to the Bible) so that "God told me/spoke to me/revealed to me" is how Joseph Smith the founder of Mormonism. Muhammad the found of Islam were all continuationists who claimed an angel gave them new revelation/Scripture (which I believe actually happened, but the angel of light was not from God as proven by the revelations that not only contradict the Bible but have a works based system of salvation, and deny critical aspects of Jesus - his diety, his humanity, his sinlessness, his sacrifice, his resurrection, or his return.

- - Distraction from Doctrine progressively obeying what God commands in Scripture They often emphasize signs, wonders, miracles and supernatural spiritual gifts rather than holy living, knowing and living out

- Disorder Disorderly Worship Unbiblical/chaotic worship They often participate in unruly, disorderly, and chaotic worship that is not from God as God would never seek worship, empower worship, or promote worship that goes

against his word - multiple tongue speaking no interpreters as 1 Cor. 12-14 is clear tongues is a sign for unbelievers, to hear the gospel in their own language, and must always have an interpret be done with decency and order... and with prophecy there must be at the most 2 or 3. This is why TBC firmly believes that 1 Cor 12-14 is a warning about the abuse of spiritual gifts to draw attention to one self instead of edifiving/building up the church in love as it says without love we are/have nothing. And we are cessationists because Paul makes it clear not to clamor or misuse these gifts because even three of the gifts prophecy, knowledge, and tongues will cease when the telios/MATURITY of the church comes. And it clearly has ceased because I know of no so called modern Apostle who can on command or with verification do what I call the "stuff" perform the signs, wonders, and miracles. No one can do it – no Pentecostal/charismatic church avoided Covid, none of their Apostles went healed all the people dving of Covid. because they can't do the stuff and are false apostles.

- - IShonest Gain deceit, greed, for Personal Profit throughout our country and especially in Africa "faith healers" so called "Apostles" are taking advantage of the poor and desperate it sounds like this, if you

just sow your seed of faith and give me your money, you are guaranteed for God to heal you, bless you financially, give you YOUR MIRACLE/so you will have your BEST LIFE NOW. Watch out for the preachers who say God told them they need a private leer iet and multiple mansions and especially to old people who have failing health to give their savings to them while promising God is going to make everything rich like them. This is nothing more than a devilish ponsi scheme – so watch out for the The Kenneth Copelands, Benny Hinns, Richard Tiltons, Creflo Dollar, TD Jakes, Joel Osteens of our world, and almost all the preachers on TBN are false teachers who are enriching themselves by bilking the poor.

of the world think Jesus and Christians are not just freaks, crazy, but funny hilarious FAKES and FRUADS. One charlatan we saw in Africa while we were in Uganda was promising people God would give them a Lambrigini and park it next to his if they just gave everything/money they needed to feed their kids - to him. So sad/tragic how they are misrepresenting the real Jesus, distorting the

- Bible and the real gospel, and making real Christians look ridiculous so I always tell people don't make your decision about Jesus and the Bible based on someone's poor or false representation but make your decision on Jesus himself by reading God's Word for vourself.

Disappointment - many Charasmatics/Pentecostals become disillusioned end of leaving the church all together after being totally disappointed and disenfranchised from the church - why? They eventually see the


greed of their Pastors, or realize that their Pastors or healers can't really do the stuff - heal them or others, they don't get healed, they don't get rich, they modern church can't really do everything the Apostles or the early did what they read the book of Acts so some punt and throw away the faith altogether because to them it simply doesn't WORK as their leaders promised them. The modern church is still impacted by accidents, sickness, disease, tragedies, they still get Covid, they still get sick, their old and most faithful saints still die because of the curse of sin, some still get cancer and die without healing even thought they enough faith that God would heal them or their loved one. But many are given unbiblical EXPECTATIONS and are not taught nor understand ALL that the Bible promises believers for this life... joy in the midst of persecution, perseverance/perspective in the face of pain/sorrow, fellowship/genuine love among believers in the midst of a hateful/selfish/sinful world, resurrection and entrance into the Kingdom AFTER we die or after the church is raptured, and that our best life is not NOW (this is the proving/testing grounds for those who love/follow Jesus and Lord in order to enter His future Kingdom) but LATER – when we rule and reign with Him for 1000 years and beyond in His Kingdom that will never end.

and for some and probably many – many of these churches don't preach the real gospel/good news of Jesus Christ resulting in pseudo/false converts – don't explain His perfect life to impute perfect righteous standing with

God, don't explain His sacrificial death, specifically Jesus' blood as the payment to God to free us from God's coming wrath/perfect justice against all sin and every sinner, don't explain His victorious resurrection and ongoing intercession for us from heaven as our constant hope and solace when we continue to struggle with sin even after we are saved. And don't preach or urge biblical repentance, faith, and willingness to follow Jesus as Lord with your whole life rather than through some cheap words or momentary spiritual experiences. So that the most scary passage in the Bible and most tragic words to ever hear are heard by many who are "religious but not saved." Matthew 7:22-23 22 "Many will say to Me on that day. Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in Your name, and in Your name cast out demons, and in Your name perform many miracles?' 23 And then I will declare to them. I never knew you: DEPART FROM ME. YOU WHO PRACTICE LAWLESSNESS.

1.	Word of Wisdom	λόγος σοφίας: logos (word) sophias (of wisdom). Logos is a spoken word or message, divine revelation. Sophia is wisdom, insight, understanding, ability to use knowledge for correct behavior. Necessary in counseling to correct, encourage, and comfort – similar or same as exhortation
2.	Word of Knowledge	λόγος γνώσεως: logos (word) gnoseos (of knowledge). Gnosis is knowledge or information critical to have understanding. It is a result of divine revelation (logos) that enlightens us to know the truth and have sound doctrine. Similar to preaching/teaching but the word/message was derived directly by the Holy Spirit since the Canon of Scripture was not complete. 1 Corinthians 13:8-10 says this gift will cease.
3.	Faith	πίστις: pistis (faith). Faith is trust, confidence, reliance on someone/something, or commitment, conviction, or pledge, or content of what is essential to Christian belief and practice/sound doctrine. Necessary in faithful/expectant prayer for God to act or overcoming/persevering belief in the face of adversity that doesn't give up but stays faithful.
4.	Gifts of Healing	χαρίσματα ἰαμάτων: charismata (gifts) iamaton (of healings). Gifts are benefits/favors of God by grace - given or bestowed without regard to merit (undeserved). Healings are the divine power to cure, remedy, or make well again. Necessary in making the lame walk, blind see, and diseased cured. The closest modern parallel are those who pray for physical healing or the medicine/physicians who help people become physically well or whole.
5.	Works of Power	ἐνεργήματα δυνάμεων: energamata (works/effects) dunameon (of powers). Works are divine/supernatural acts that have been accomplished by divine energy/power. Necessary in casting out demons, controlling nature, or displaying wonders. The closest modern parallel are those who pray and fast for God to supernaturally free people from demonic oppression/possession or ask God to soften/save the souls of unbelievers.

6.	Prophecy	προφητεία: prophateia (prophecy). Inspired speaking, divine utterance revealing God's purposes/will, or divine prediction of future events. Necessary in teaching/instructing the early church without the completion of the New Testament. This is the only gift listed exactly the same from Romans 12:6-8 and 1 Cor. 13:8-10 says this gift will cease. This gift will be reestablished during the Tribulation (Joel 2) and the two witnesses/prophets (Revelation 11).
7.	Discernment (Distinguishing Spirits)	διακρίσεις πνευμάτων: diakriseis (judging/discerning) pneumaton (spirits). <i>Dia</i> means "through" and <i>krino</i> means "to judge or decide." Ability to judge, decide, evaluate, discern, or separate between spirits (from <i>pneo</i> meaning "to blow" like the wind). Necessary in discerning/separating all of Satan's religious counterfeits, substitutions, and additions to sound doctrine and infiltrations into the church. We still need to recognize false teachers, false converts, and false teaching in our churches today.
8.	Kinds of Tongues	γένη γλωσσῶν: gena (kinds) glosson (tongues/languages). Genos (descendent, family, ethnic group, race, nation – ex. subclass "genus" from kingdom, phylum, class, order, family, genus, species). Glossa (tongue, language, verbal communication). Necessary for spreading the gospel to foreign peoples/languages. 1 Cor. 14:22 says that tongues are a sign for unbelievers. 1 Cor. 14:27-28 says tongues if practiced must be interpreted (so people know what is people said) and should be done one at a time. 1 Cor.13:8-10 says this gift will cease.
9.	Interpreting Tongues	έρμηνεία γλωσσῶν: ermaneia (interpretation) glosson (of tongues/languages). Interpretation is translating, explaining what is said in a foreign language so that it is intelligible and can be understood by the listener. We get the word "hermeneutics" (to translate) from this word as it is the translation/interpretation of Scripture. If speaking in tongues ceases in 1 Cor. 13:8-10 than also the need to interpret such tongues.

Now in these days the disciples were multiplying (and) there became grumbling (from) the Hellenists towards the Hebrews because their widows were overlooked in the daily service. But the twelve having summoned the multitude of the disciples they said "It is not desirable for us having left the word of the God to serve tables. But you all shall see to it brothers men from out of you all testifying seven full of the spirit and wisdom which we will set over the need of these. But we will continue (in) the prayer and the service of the Word. And the word pleased before/with everyone of the multitude and they chose Stephen a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, and Philip, and Prochorus, and Nicanor, and Timon, and Parmenas and Nicolas, a proselyte from Antioch, which causing to stand before the Apostles and having prayed they laid on them the hands. And the Word of God grew and multiplied greatly the number of the disciples in Jerusalem. (And) many from the crowd of the priests became obedient (to) the faith. **Acts 6:1** Now at this time while the disciples were increasing *in number*, a complaint arose on the part of the Hellenistic *Jews* against the *native* Hebrews, because their widows were being overlooked in the daily serving *of food*.

Complaint - γογγυσμός goggusmos: a muttering, murmuring (root: γογγύζω gogguzo: to mutter, murmur)

a. Colossians 3 it – if preference/non-sin issues...<u>overlook it</u> with grace, forbearance, and love (love covers over/protects not exposes – Prov. 10:12, 1 Peter 4:8)

**Colossians 3:12-14** <sup>12</sup> So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience; <sup>13</sup> bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you. <sup>14</sup> Beyond all these things *put on* love, which is the perfect bond of unity.

b. **Matthew 5-7 it** — no matter if a preference or sin issue...**pray about it** and first examine your own heart, motives, and actions from God's perspective and from the other person's viewpoint, but always with a humble attitude to forgive as the Lord has already forgiven us.

Matthew 5:44 <sup>44</sup> "But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you,

**Matthew 6:12-15** Pray in this way...<sup>12</sup> 'And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. <sup>13</sup> 'And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil. *For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen*.' <sup>14</sup> "For if you forgive others for their transgressions, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. <sup>15</sup> "But if you do not forgive others, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions.

### 5 Biblical Ways/Stages to Address Complaints in the Church:

c. **Romans 12 it** – if continues to hinder the relationship – <u>address it</u> by going to the person one to one/privately *before*/without talking about the person or the problem with others in order to pursue the highest level of reconciliation possible by seeking clarification, talking out any miscommunication, and working out any misunderstandings. \*\*\*Keep the circle of the problem as small as possible (who is part of the problem and the solution)

**Romans 12:10-18** <sup>10</sup> *Be* devoted to one another in brotherly love; give preference to one another in honor; <sup>11</sup> not lagging behind in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; <sup>12</sup> rejoicing in hope, persevering in tribulation, devoted to prayer, <sup>13</sup> contributing to the needs of the saints, practicing hospitality. <sup>14</sup> Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse. <sup>15</sup> Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep. <sup>16</sup> Be of the same mind toward one another; do not be haughty in mind, but associate with the lowly. Do not be wise in your own estimation. <sup>17</sup> Never pay back evil for evil to anyone. Respect what is right in the sight of all men. <sup>18</sup> If possible, so far as it depends on you, be at peace with all men.

**Matthew 5:23-24** <sup>23</sup> "Therefore if you are presenting your offering at the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you, <sup>24</sup> leave your offering there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother, and then come and present your offering.

# 1. How to biblically handle **complaints** in the church **5** Biblical Ways/Stages to Address Complaints in the Church:

- d. **Acts 6 it** if it's a church problem that is hurting the church or those in the church but not necessarily a sin issue by an individual <u>let the Elders know about it</u> (take any complaints or problems in the church to the Elders so they can address and solve the problem or work on the weakness)
- The Elders should address and fix any problems quickly, in a timely matter
- The Elders obviously met and reached unanimity in how to address and fix the problem (notice they did not ignore, deny or downplay the problem but acknowledged it and quickly worked to fix it)
- The Elders involved/consulted the entire congregation for their collective wisdom in order to arrive at the best solution
- The Elders delegated the action phase to others, the work/service to godly/spiritual men not only to bring about the best solution for the church but also to protect their service/ministry/calling to prioritize prayer and the teaching of the Word
- The delegated authority of the Elders was bestowed only after Elders prayed and established specific SPIRITUAL qualifications/criteria (Ex. Titus 1 / 1 Tim. 3)
- The Elders have the final authority in the church as the decision makers of the church by selecting seven prototype deacons by the laying on of their hands

Acts 6:1-4 Now at this time while the disciples were increasing *in number*, a complaint arose on the part of the Hellenistic *Jews* against the *native* Hebrews, because their widows were being overlooked in the daily serving *of food.* <sup>2</sup> So the twelve summoned the congregation of the disciples and said, "It is not desirable for us to neglect the word of God in order to serve tables. <sup>3</sup> "Therefore, brethren, select from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may put in charge of this task. <sup>4</sup> "But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word."

# 1. How to biblically handle **complaints** in the church (conflict resolution/problem solving)

### 5 Biblical Ways/Stages to Address Complaints in the Church:

- e. **Matthew 18 it** if it's an obvious sin issue, <u>confront it</u>, but it must be a clear action against a clear Scripture with clear evidence) follow the 4 steps of Matthew 18:15-17
  - Go 1 to 1 to seek their repentance and restoration (protect their reputation)
  - Confirm with 2 or 3 witnesses to seek their repentance and restoration (evidence/confirmation)
  - Tell it to the church in order for the weight/power of the entire church to urgently call them to repentance with motivation of restoration not repudiation
  - Remove them from the church (protect the reputation/holiness of the church) and evangelize them as an unbeliever

**Matthew 18:15-17** <sup>15</sup> "If your brother sins, go and show him his fault in private; if he listens to you, you have won your brother. 
<sup>16</sup> "But if he does not listen *to you*, take one or two more with you, so that BY THE MOUTH OF TWO OR THREE WITNESSES EVERY FACT MAY BE CONFIRMED. 
<sup>17</sup> "If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector.

James 5:19-20 <sup>19</sup> My brethren, if any among you strays from the truth and one turns him back, <sup>20</sup> let him know that he who turns a sinner from the error of his way will save his soul from death and will cover a multitude of sins.

# 2. How to biblically **lead** the church (Biblical roles of Elders and Deacons and the Congregation)

Acts 6:2-4 <sup>2</sup> So the twelve summoned the congregation of the disciples and said, "It is not desirable for us to neglect the word of God in order to serve tables. <sup>3</sup> "Therefore, brethren, select from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may put in charge of this task. <sup>4</sup> "But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word."

### The Elders two main priorities must be and must remain/continue to be:

- 1. **Prayer** προσευχή proseuche: prayer, Origin: προσεύχομαι proseuchomai: to pray, Root πρός pros: to, towards AND εὔχομαι euchomai: to pray
- 2. **Ministry of the Word** διακονία diakonia: service, ministry, Root: διάκονος diakonos: a servant, minister, λόγος logos: a word (as embodying an idea), a statement, a speech, a message (divine message), Root: λέγω lego: to say (what God has to say to us divine revelation)

Acts 6:4 τῆ διακονία τοῦ λόγου (lit. the service/ministry of the Word)

### Biblical Qualifications of an Elder

- **Titus 1:5-9** <sup>5</sup> For this reason I left you in Crete, that you would set in order what remains and appoint elders in every city as I directed you, <sup>6</sup> *namely*, if any man is above reproach, the husband of one wife, having children who believe, not accused of dissipation or rebellion. <sup>7</sup> For the overseer must be above reproach as God's steward, not self-willed, not quick-tempered, not addicted to wine, not pugnacious, not fond of sordid gain, <sup>8</sup> but hospitable, loving what is good, sensible, just, devout, self-controlled, <sup>9</sup> holding fast the faithful word which is in accordance with the teaching, so that he will be able both to exhort in sound doctrine and to refute those who contradict.
- 1 Timothy 3:1-7 It is a trustworthy statement: if any man aspires to the office of overseer, it is a fine work he desires to do. <sup>2</sup> An overseer, then, must be above reproach, the husband of one wife, temperate, prudent, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, <sup>3</sup> not addicted to wine or pugnacious, but gentle, peaceable, free from the love of money. <sup>4</sup> He must be one who manages his own household well, keeping his children under control with all dignity <sup>5</sup> (but if a man does not know how to manage his own household, how will he take care of the church of God?), <sup>6</sup> and not a new convert, so that he will not become conceited and fall into the condemnation incurred by the devil. <sup>7</sup> And he must have a good reputation with those outside the church, so that he will not fall into reproach and the snare of the devil.

#### Paul's Example of a Good Elder

Acts 20:18-27 "You yourselves know, from the first day that I set foot in Asia, how I was with you the whole time, <sup>19</sup> serving the Lord with all humility and with tears and with trials which came upon me through the plots of the Jews; <sup>20</sup> how I did not shrink from declaring to you anything that was profitable, and teaching you publicly and from house to house, <sup>21</sup> solemnly testifying to both Jews and Greeks of repentance toward God and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>22</sup> "And now, behold, bound in spirit, I am on my way to Jerusalem, not knowing what will happen to me there, 23 except that the Holy Spirit solemnly testifies to me in every city, saying that bonds and afflictions await me. <sup>24</sup> "But I do not consider my life of any account as dear to myself, so that I may finish my course and the ministry which I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify solemnly of the gospel of the grace of God. <sup>25</sup> "And now, behold, I know that all of you, among whom I went about preaching the kingdom, will no longer see my face. <sup>26</sup> "Therefore, I testify to you this day that I am innocent of the blood of all men. <sup>27</sup> "For I did not shrink from declaring to you the whole purpose of God.

### Peter's Example of a Biblical Elder:

**1 Peter 5:1-4** Therefore, I exhort the elders among you, as *your* fellow elder and witness of the sufferings of Christ, and a partaker also of the glory that is to be revealed, <sup>2</sup> shepherd the flock of God among you, exercising oversight not under compulsion, but voluntarily, according to *the will of* God; and not for sordid gain, but with eagerness; <sup>3</sup> nor yet as lording it over those allotted to your charge, but proving to be examples to the flock. <sup>4</sup> And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory.

# The Primary Difference between the Elders & Deacons: Teaching/Preaching

**Philippians 1:1** Paul and Timothy, bond-servants of Christ Jesus, To all the saints in Christ Jesus who are in Philippi, including the <u>overseers and deacons</u>:

- **Elders** (presbuteros) are the Pastors/shepherds (poimen), overseers (episkopos), preachers (Kerux/heralds who kerusso/proclaim God's Word) and teachers (didaskalos), administrators (kebernesis/steering, govern) who are the decision makers of the church
- **Deacons**/servants (diakonos) are the helpers (antilempsis, sunergeo), model servants who exemplify to the members/congregation how to sacrificially and faithfully serve within the church by assisting the Elders to execute/enact their decisions and protect the Elders time to devote themselves to prayer and to the study/teaching/preaching of the Word of God.
- 1 Corinthians 12:28 <sup>28</sup> And God has appointed in the church, first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healings, helps, administrations, various kinds of tongues.
- **1 Peter 4:11** <sup>11</sup> Whoever speaks, *is to do so* as one who is speaking the utterances of God; whoever serves *is to do so* as one who is serving by the strength which God supplies; so that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belongs the glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.



# TBC Constitution - Article VI: Deacon Board


- Must be Faithful Members
- Must be Biblically Qualified Men (1 Timothy 3:8-13)
- Must be Willing to serve in the function/role/responsibilities of a Deacon
- Must complete the Deacon Candidate Process

## Biblical Qualifications for a Deacon

• 1 Timothy 3:8-13 8 Deacons likewise *must be* men of dignity, not double-tongued, or addicted to much wine or fond of sordid gain, 9 but holding to the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. 10 These men must also first be tested; then let them serve as deacons if they are beyond reproach. <sup>11</sup> Women *must* likewise *be* dignified, not malicious gossips, but temperate, faithful in all things. 12 Deacons must be husbands of only one wife, and good managers of their children and their own households. 13 For those who have served well as deacons obtain for themselves a high standing and great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus.

## TBC Deacon Training Process

- Initial Identification by the Elders (who is a faithful member setting the example of service for the church?)
- Training by the Elders (The New Testament Deacon by Alexander Strauch)
- Evaluation by the Elders and Congregation (Personal Evaluation, Spouse Evaluation, Congregational Evaluation, Elder Evaluation)
- Approval of new Deacons by the Elders (Unanimity/Prayer)
- Appointment of new Deacons by the Elders (laying on of hands)

# 3. How to biblically **take care** of our own people and their physical needs (benevolence)

### Acts 6:1 widows were being overlooked in the daily serving of food.

- Fairness there should be no racial, educational, or economic bias or unfairness in the church (Ex. Hellenist/Gentile Christians vs Hebrews/Jewish Christians)
- Commitment We are committed at TBC that no member of TBC ever be in need of food, clothing, and shelter. (We are committed FIRST and FOREMOST to the brethren/members of our church and then as able to meeting the physical needs of others as an expression of love and testimony to the Biblical gospel, but never enabling/always requiring references, counseling requirements, work requirements, and church requirements)

Acts 2:44-45 <sup>44</sup> And all those who had believed were together and had all things in common; <sup>45</sup> and they *began* selling their property and possessions and were sharing them with all, as anyone might have need.

**2 Thessalonians 3:10-13** <sup>10</sup> For even when we were with you, we used to give you this order: if anyone is not willing to work, then he is not to eat, either. <sup>11</sup> For we hear that some among you are leading an undisciplined life, doing no work at all, but acting like busybodies. <sup>12</sup> Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to work in quiet fashion and eat their own bread. <sup>13</sup> But as for you, brethren, do not grow weary of doing good.

**James 1:27** Pure and undefiled religion in the sight of *our* God and Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their distress, *and* to keep oneself unstained by the world.

**1 John 3:16-18** <sup>16</sup> We know love by this, that He laid down His life for us; and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren. <sup>17</sup> But whoever has the world's goods, and sees his brother in need and closes his heart against him, how does the love of God abide in him? <sup>18</sup> Little children, let us not love with word or with tongue, but in deed and truth.

## 4. How to biblically select new church leaders (Prototype Deacons)

(Church leaders/Deacons must be spiritual not just reputable)

Acts 6:3 Therefore, brethren, select from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may put in charge of this task.

- Select ἐπισκέπτομαι episkeptomai: to inspect, by ext. to go to see,
   Origin: σκοπός skopos: a watchman, a mark (on which to fix the eye)
   Root: from σκέπτομαι skeptomai (to look carefully, consider)
- ✓ Good reputation (lit. well testified of) μαρτυρέω martureo: to bear witness, testify
- ✓ **Full of the Spirit and Wisdom** πλήρεις πνεύματος καὶ σοφίας (πνεῦμα pneuma: wind, spirit, σοφία sophia: skill, wisdom)
- ✓ **Able to lead** put in charge of this task (lit. appointed to this need) καθίστημι kathistemi: to set in order, appoint, χρεία chreia: need, task, business

#### Ex. Stephen – Acts 6:5, 6:8

- √ man full of faith (πίστις pistis: faith, faithfulness) and of the Holy Spirit
- ✓ full of grace (χάρις charis: grace, kindness) and power (δύναμις dunamis: (miraculous) power, might, strength)
- Was doing great wonders (τέρας teras: a wonder, marvel) and signs (σημεῖον semeion: a sign)

## 5. How to biblically **grow** as a church (Church Growth)

Acts 6:1 Now at this time while the disciples were increasing in number,

**Acts 6:7** The word of God kept on spreading; and the number of the disciples continued to increase greatly in Jerusalem,

### The early church grew/multiplied greatly because of:

- God's Grace, Will, and Power God ultimately gave the increase for His own honor, glory, and perfect will
- 2. The Early Church's Obedience They were prayerful, wordful (full of the Word) and ultimately FAITHFUL (especially in evangelism/the Great Commission, to be His witnesses/ambassadors to the world

Acts 1:8 8 but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth." (Mt. 25:21-23 "well done, good and faithful slave.")

# 6. How to biblically **reach** even the most resistant people (the religious but not saved)

Acts 6:7 <sup>7</sup> The word of God kept on spreading; and the number of the disciples continued to increase greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were becoming obedient to the faith.

What convinced the crowd of priests to believe in Jesus/convert from the legalism of Judaism to the grace of Christianity? Probably not one thing but the collect testimony and witness of:

1. Undeniable Truth/Fact-based Faith - they realized that Jesus did fulfill all of their O.T. Scriptures

**Matthew 5:17-18** <sup>17</sup> "Do not think that I came to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I did not come to abolish but to fulfill. <sup>18</sup> "For truly I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter or stroke shall pass from the Law until all is accomplished.

**Acts 3:18** <sup>18</sup> "But the things which God announced beforehand by the mouth of all the prophets, that His Christ would suffer, He has thus fulfilled.

**Acts 9:22** <sup>22</sup> But Saul kept increasing in strength and confounding the Jews who lived at Damascus by proving that this *Jesus* is the Christ.

**Acts 17:2-3** reasoned with them from the Scriptures, <sup>3</sup> explaining and giving evidence that the Christ had to suffer and rise again from the dead, and *saying*, "This Jesus whom I am proclaiming to you is the Christ."

**Acts 18:28** <sup>28</sup> for he (Apollos) powerfully refuted the Jews in public, demonstrating by the Scriptures that Jesus was the Christ.

**2. Real Love and Life Change/Obedience** – they saw the real love, grace, compassion, and kindness/care that the N.T. church had towards meeting the needs of its own and even outsiders and it was attractive and compelling

**John 13:34-35** <sup>34</sup> "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. <sup>35</sup> "By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another."

**John 14:21-23** <sup>21</sup> "He who has My commandments and keeps them is the one who loves Me; and he who loves Me will be loved by My Father, and I will love him and will disclose Myself to him." ... <sup>23</sup> Jesus answered and said to him, "If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word; and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our abode with him.

**1 John 2:3-5** <sup>3</sup> By this we know that we have come to know Him, if we keep His commandments... <sup>5</sup> but whoever keeps His word, in him the love of God has truly been perfected. By this we know that we are in Him:

1 John 4:12 if we love one another, God abides in us, and His love is perfected in us.

# 6. How to biblically **reach** even the most resistant people (the religious but not saved)

Acts 6:7 <sup>7</sup> The word of God kept on spreading; and the number of the disciples continued to increase greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were becoming obedient to the faith.

**3. Supernatural Power from God** –they saw signs, wonders, and miracles and believed because they knew that God was at work/doing these miracles as evidence/proof of Jesus (Lord, Christ) and His gospel.

**John 2:23** <sup>23</sup> Now when He was in Jerusalem at the Passover, during the feast, many believed in His name, observing His signs which He was doing.

**John 3:2** <sup>2</sup> this man (Nicodemus) came to Jesus by night and said to Him, "Rabbi, we know that You have come from God *as* a teacher; for no one can do these signs that You do unless God is with him."

**John 10:36-38** I said, 'I am the Son of God '? <sup>37</sup> "If I do not do the works of My Father, do not believe Me; <sup>38</sup> but if I do them, though you do not believe Me, believe the works, so that you may know and understand that the Father is in Me, and I in the Father."

Acts 4:16 "What shall we do with these men? For the fact that a noteworthy miracle has taken place through them is apparent to all who live in Jerusalem, and we cannot deny it.

Acts 2:22 <sup>22</sup> "Men of Israel, listen to these words: Jesus the Nazarene, a man attested to you by God with miracles and wonders and signs which God performed through Him in your midst, just as you yourselves know—

Acts 10:38 <sup>38</sup> " You know of Jesus of Nazareth, how God anointed Him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and how He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him.

### 7. How to biblically serve and imitate powerful men like Stephen

Acts 6:5 Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit ... Acts 6:8-10 8 And Stephen, full of grace and power, was performing great wonders and signs among the people. ... But they were unable to cope with the wisdom and the Spirit with which he was speaking.

### Stephen was filled FULL of the Holy Spirit – Acts 6:5, 6:8

- √ Full of faith (πίστις pistis: faith, faithfulness)
- √ Full of the Holy Spirit (πνεῦμα pneuma: wind) (ἄγιος hagios: sacred, holy)
- ✓ Full of grace (χάρις charis: grace, kindness) and power (δύναμις dunamis: (miraculous) power, might, strength)
- √ Full of wisdom (σοφία sophia: skill, wisdom)

Are you FULL of God Spirit and Power through Prayer?

Are you FULL of God's TRUTH and wisdom through His Word?

Are you Full of Faith and Grace because you are spending quality time with Jesus and becoming more like Him?

Or are you empty – little power because of little prayer, little wisdom because of little Word, little faith and little grace because you spend little time with Jesus?

Lord help me, help TBC be FAITHFUL!

**2 Timothy 2:1-2** You therefore, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. <sup>2</sup> The things which you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses, entrust these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also.

**Matthew 24:45-46** <sup>45</sup> "Who then is the faithful and sensible slave whom his master put in charge of his household to give them their food at the proper time? <sup>46</sup> "Blessed is that slave whom
