

(10 Truths of Evangelism) (The gift of the Holy Spirit and Believer's Baptism)

I. Text: Acts 10:43-48 43 Of Him all the prophets bear witness that through His name everyone who believes in Him receives forgiveness of sins." 44 While Peter was still speaking these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all those who were listening to the word. 45 And all the circumcised believers who came with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out on the Gentiles also. 46 For they were hearing them speaking with tongues and magnifying God. Then Peter answered, 47 "Can anyone refuse water for these to be baptized who have received the Holy Spirit just as we did?" 48 And he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked him to remain for a few days.

The three main points of the sermon are: 1. Jesus died for EVERYONE / salvation is available all (everyone who believes receives forgiveness of sins) - why is UNLIMITED ATONEMENT not only Biblical but also vital/important to our church or how we approach evangelism? 2. True believers are given the GIFT of the Holy Spirit who indwells, empowers, and enables Biblical change – What evidence should you look for/how do you recognize real Christians who are truly baptized/dwelt by the Holy Spirit? 3. True believers DESIRE to publicly identify with the Lord as His followers/worshippers and other believers in a local church through believers baptism - How should we approach someone who claims to be a Christian but is reluctant, avoiding, or even dismissive of the importance of water baptism after

For those who claim tongues are still for today, or that someone has to speak in tongues in order to be saved – how would you answer them from Scripture? (Read in 1 Cor. 12:40 - not every speaks in tongues/tongues clearly are NOT a requirement for salvation, 1 Cor. 13:8 tongues, prophecy, and gift of knowledge will cease when the maturity of the church comes). Not everyone even in Acts speaks in tongues when they are saved (Jerusalem - Acts 2, Samaria - Acts 8, Saul - Acts 9, Gentiles - Acts 10, Philippians -Acts 16, Ephesians - Acts 19). IV. Application: Romans 8:1-16 (Make sure you have evidence/fruits of the Holy Spirit showing your commitment to Christ as Lord is genuine – including basic bench marks of Christianity – believer's baptism, church membership, daily devotions, evangelism, and progressive sanctification/growth in Christlikeness and willingness, pursuit, and obedience to Christ's commands)

(10:47-48) Jesus' command for believers to be baptized in W (should be soon after conversion as EVIDENCE/proof of salvation)

- Baptized in water (βαπτίζω baptizo: to dip, sink, immerse, envelope/overwhelm completely)
- Who have received the Holy Spirit (λαμβάνω lambano: to take, receive)
- Baptized in the NAME of Jesus Christ (ὄνομα *onoma*: a name, authority, cause)
