
#### I. Text:

#### II. Introduction:

- A. What kind of DAD are you? (strengths and weaknesses) What would your wife say? What would your children say? What would your believing friends say? What would unbelieving friends say? What does God say?
- B. Radio Program: Today In Perspective with Dr. Harry Reeder Series: A Biblical Duty for Dads U.S. Census Bureau, 17.8 million children, nearly 1 in 4, live without a biological, step, or adoptive father in the home. Study by the Swiss Government (1990s)...If both Father and Mother attend church regularly, 33% of their children will end up attending church regularly, 41% will attend occasionally, and 25% will not attend at all. If the Father is not attending church at all and the mother attends church regularly, just 2% of their children will become be regular worshippers, 37% will attend occasionally, and over 60% will be lost completely to the church. Why Ephesians 6 specifically addresses DADS to bring up their children in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.
- C. Youth from our youth group in Denver: "I wish my parents disciplined me at least then I would know that they care about me." (Hebrews 12:5-13)

How can you/Christian dads practically improve their mission to evangelize, disciple, discipline, and instruct their children in the Lord?

#### **III. Evaluation Questions for Christian Dads**

- Are you pursuing your God-given role not only as a Protector and Provider, but also as the Spiritual Head/leader of your home who loves, nourishes, and cherishes his wife (Eph. 5:25-33), and who loves his children by training, evangelizing, and discipling his children in the fear and admonition of the Lord? (Proverbs 22:6)
- 2. Do you have clear household rules, standards, and expectations? (Exodus 20:3-17)
- 3. Do you have clear and consistent consequences disciplining your children in truth and love not anger or abuse? (Hebrews 12:9-13)
- 4. Are you leading regular family worship/devotions & praying with your wife & kids? (Col. 3:12-17)
- 5. Are you spending quality time discipling/mentoring your children? (Deut. 6:4-9)
- 6. Are you loving your children in the greatest way possible by Biblically loving their mother/your wife? (secure, peaceful, loving home) (Col. 3:19)
- 7. Are you the spiritual leader, pacesetter, and good spiritual example to your children? (1 Tim. 4:12)
- 8. Are you faithfully obeying the commands in Scripture specifically addressed to fathers? (Eph. 6:4, Col. 3:21, 1 John 2:13-14)

#### Application: Resolved - to repent, recommit, and reach out (accountability)! (The Resolutions of Johnathan Edwards) (Lord Jesus Help me THIS DAY prayers)

Acts 13:43 Paul and Barnabas, who, speaking to them, were urging them to continue in the grace of God. Acts 11:23-24 23 Then when he arrived and witnessed the grace of God, he rejoiced and began to encourage them all with resolute heart to remain true to the Lord; 24 for he was a good man, and full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. And considerable numbers were brought to the Lord.

#### Repent - Recommit - Reach Out (Reset, Refit, Retool, Resolve)

- II. Recommit Make a Decision Commit, Resolve, Pursue (Put on ALL righteousness)


III. Reach Out/Share your plan with others/Seek Accountability (ask them to pray for you, keep you


- accountable/ ask the hard questions regularly, and encourage you to reset when you fail or fall short)
  - A. Set and Keep a Biblical Schedule with your spiritual priorities planned and non-negotiable (early to bed, early to rise, disciplined in fruitfruits)
    - 1. Consistent in Personal Devotions (Qtime, AWG, Power Pray, Organize, Word, Exercise, Recite/review)
    - 2. Consistent in Family Devotions (Family Worship read, discuss, pray, memorize)
    - 3. Consistent in Church (Worship, Fellowship, Service, Evangelism, Discipleship)

#### B. Set and Keep a Biblical Lifestyle

- 1. Healthy diet drink more water, portion control, limit sugar, carbs, processed/fast foods, caffeine, eat more fruits, vegetables, protein, set times to eat, consider some fasting, eliminate alcohol, nicotine, drugs
- 2. Physical Exercise cardio/endurance, weights/strength training, stretching/flexibility
- 3. Time Management Be more productive/eternal minded (Read Christian books, learn an instrument or foreign language instead of wasting your time with TV/movies/internet/social media/video games)
- C. Set and Pursue specific Biblical Goals (day, week, month, year, 3 year, 5 year, 10 year)
  - 1. Relationship with God (Devotional Life) (Ex. Read the Bible through in 6 months before 50<sup>th</sup> bday)
  - 2. Relationship with Spouse (Married Life) (Ex. Plan/pray together, daily walks, read marriage book, plan & keep more time together, prioritize/communicate/listen to M above others)
  - 3. Relationship with Children (Ex. Parenting Life) (Ex. Get individual time with each kid each week, disciple with 7 TBC classes)
  - 4. Relationship with Believers (Church Life) (Ex. Invite every TBC member over for dinner this year)

5. Relationship with Unbelievers (Evangelism/Witnessing Life) (Ex. Make the most of every opportunity) (Ex. D.L. Moody talk to at least one person about the Lord each day)



13:45 Jealous Jews – jealous because of the numbers/crowds/public interest

Nothing new under the sun – humans always have and will struggle with popularity, acceptance, fame, etc.)

but also contradict (oppose, challenge, say something different)

and even blaspheme – speak untruths, lies, and evil specifically about God).

Acts 13:46 Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly and said, "It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you first; since you repudiate it and judge yourselves unworthy of eternal life, behold, we are turning to the Gentiles.

13:46 Paul and Barnabus meet this opposition with BOLDNESS – bold in that they don't avoid confrontation, they address it head on, and even boldly state and expose the sin going on

...specifically YOUR REPUDIATE/reject the gospel and especially the hard but true reality – you have "judged yourselves unworthy of eternal life (condemnation/damnation/eternal separation),

and even end with a bold statement that addresses long standing prejudice, hatred, and racial division – "we are turning to the Gentiles (who you thought were unworthy of eternal life – but are, are loved by God, are included in salvation – Jesus did die for their sins, and so the gospel is offered to EVERYBODY. Acts 13:47 "For so the Lord has commanded us, 'I HAVE PLACED YOU AS A LIGHT FOR THE GENTILES, THAT YOU MAY BRING SALVATION TO THE END OF THE EARTH."

13:47 Light to the Gentiles – <u>Isaiah 42:6, 49:6</u>, 60:3, Luke 2:32, 1 Peter 2:9

Salvation to the ends of the earth (Psalm 67:2, 98:3, <u>Isaiah</u> 52:10, Ps. 2:8, 22:27)

Acts 13:47 "For so the Lord has commanded us, 'I HAVE PLACED YOU AS A LIGHT FOR THE GENTILES, THAT YOU MAY BRING SALVATION TO THE END OF THE EARTH."

13:48a When you and I realized, grip, grasp that you have been saved, all that you have been saved from, and how gracious/gloriously the Lord loved and accomplished salvation for us...

You and I will (or should) rejoice and glorify God for our salvation just as the Gentiles rejoice and worship God here when they realize that Jesus' salvation reaches to them too!

13:48b Just because the strong Calvinist love and focus on this verse – doesn't mean we shouldn't recognize its strong implications that extol the graciousness and sovereignty of God in salvation while not demanding at all that we ascribe to the whole system of Calvinism.

Yes, unless God foreknew, forordained, planned, and provided salvation – none of us would be saved, none of us would have anything to respond to, repent towards, or put our faith in – thus the credit and glory for salvation goes ALL to God. He did love and choose us first before we choose Him or reciprocate His love. His predestination or election of us does precede us and go all the way back to before the creation of the world, and so we can glory in the fact that He did choose us, call us, die for us, draw/convict us, send someone with the gospel for us, and yes convince us/enable us to have total faith in Him and His salvation without sight.

But nor does this negate the responsibility of man to repent and believe by faith, to respond to salvation by seeking, hearing, coming, choosing,, believing, and following Jesus not because we are forced to believe, follow, or worship, but out of our limited free will we reciprocate God's love and desire to have personal relationship with us. Nor does this verse say that God limits salvation, or that man is born again/regenerated BEFORE or in order to repent and have faith, but it does mean that God already knows by His perfect omniscience those He has chosen/appointed for salvation which is also as a mystery those who willingly repent, believe, and follow Him as Lord.

Yet, I caution both the Calvinists and Arminians not to try to figure out exactly how or why salvation works from God's perspective, especially any speculatation that goes beyond what the Scripture clearly states about salvation – but simply and humbly accept some of the mysteries of salvation and just be glad/rejoicing and glorifying/worshipping God because you just know its real, its available, and that it's your own – you yourself have been saved. And so I gently ask do all of you have assurance of salvation?



Acts 13:49 And the word of the Lord was being spread through the whole region.

13:49 So we pray this good news/this gospel will like here – spread throughout our entire region (St.Mary's and Calvert County) and to our Samaria (DC and surrounding areas), and to the ends of the earth (all the US and the entire world).

# Acts 13:50 But the Jews incited the devout women of prominence and the leading men of the city, and instigated a persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and drove them out of their district.

13:50 But when we are faithful and new people are being saved and added to the church – and the true universal church is growing (meaning the genuine born again Christians who truly belong to Christ around the world are increasing) ... there will be what I call "push back" opposition from Satan and demons, and even persecution from unsaved people who do not love Jesus but rather themselves and their sin, and because they are angry that we are exposing sin, or preaching Jesus as exclusive, or simply because they are jealous or possessed and empowered by the devil (btw all unbelievers are called enemies of God, children of wrath, and children of the devil until they cross over from death to life and repent and believe in Jesus for salvation) to oppose everything of God

- which means they oppose and attack His Word, His Church/true followers, and especially His gospel which is they only way, key, and door for unbelievers to escape the coming judgment of God on the devel, his fallen angels, and all those who refused/rejected the blessed gospel that Jesus Christ lived a perfect life to transfer to us His perfect righteousness so we have right standing before a perfect and Holy God, Jesus Christ died a sacrificial death to satisfy God's justice against our sins as the atonement necessary for us to be forgiven all our sins/ways we have rebelled against our creator, and Jesus Christ rose victoriously from the dead in order to prove He is God, but also to show He had conquered sin and death on our behalf so that we know His promise to raise us from the dead and bring us into His Kingdom/heaven just as He is raised is absolutely real and guaranteed by God Himself...

But Satan knowingly and unbelievers knowingly and unknowingly resist, reject, and repudiate all of this – because they are in darkness, blind, wretched, depraved... but we are in the light, safe from God's coming wrath on this wicked world, reconciled/at peace with God, and 100% assured to rule and reign with Him in His coming Kingdom which I believe is very soon as we observe that we are 2000 years after the cross and in the sixth day of a 1000 years before the 7<sup>th</sup> day/Sabbath rest of Jesus millennial/1000 year reign on the earth. Acts 13:51 But they shook off the dust of their feet in protest against them and went to Iconium.

13:51 Shake the dust of your feet – way to protest back... not with retribution or violence but with prayer for our enemies, moving on to new fertile soil or in this case people and locations that are open and receptive to the gospel.

As 1 and 2 Peter have a theme of endurance of suffering as a Christian – listen - 1 Pet. 2:19-25<sup>19</sup> For this *finds* favor, if for the sake of conscience toward God a person bears up under sorrows when suffering unjustly.<sup>20</sup> For what credit is there if, when you sin and are harshly treated, you endure it with patience? But if when you do what is right and suffer for it you patiently endure it, this finds favor with God. <sup>21</sup> For you have been called for this purpose, since Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example for you to follow in His steps, <sup>22</sup> WHO COMMITTED NO SIN, NOR WAS ANY DECEIT FOUND IN HIS MOUTH; <sup>23</sup> and while being reviled, He did not revile in return; while suffering, He uttered no threats, but kept entrusting *Himself* to Him who judges righteously; <sup>24</sup> and He Himself bore our sins in His body on the cross, so that we might die to sin and live to righteousness; for by His wounds you were healed. <sup>25</sup> For you were continually straying like sheep, but now you have returned to the Shepherd and Guardian of your souls.

Acts 13:52 And the disciples were continually filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit.

13:52 Finally – dads on Fathers Day – are you a joyful dad?

Are you a powerful dad who is constantly/continually filled with spiritual power by the Holy Spirit because you are regularly in Prayer with the ultimate Dad/God our Father?,

Because you regularly saturate your mind and your families minds with Scripture?

And because you are on point, on mission about His business to be a light for Jesus, and ambassador for the gospel, and a herald of the good new of Jesus Christ everywhere you go?



Acts 13:43 Paul and Barnabas, who, speaking to them, were urging them to continue in the grace of God.

Acts 11:23-24 23 Then when he arrived and witnessed the grace of God, he rejoiced and began to <u>encourage</u> <u>them all with resolute heart to remain true to the Lord</u>; 24 for he was **a good man**, and **full of the Holy Spirit and of faith**. And considerable numbers were brought to the Lord.

## Repent – Recommit – Reach Out (Reset, Refit, Retool, Resolve)

- I. Repent/renounce/confess your sin(s) to God (Put off ALL sin)
- II. <u>Recommit</u> Make a Decision Commit, Resolve, Pursue (Put on ALL righteousness)
- III. Reach Out/Share your plan with others/Seek Accountability (ask them to pray for you, keep you accountable/ask the hard questions regularly, and encourage you to reset when you fail or fall short)
  - A. Set and Keep a **Biblical Schedule** with your spiritual priorities planned and non-negotiable (early to bed, early to rise, disciplined in fruitfruits)
    - 1. Consistent in Personal Devotions (Qtime, AWG, Power Pray, Organize, Word, Exercise, Recite/review)
    - 2. Consistent in Family Devotions (Family Worship read, discuss, pray, memorize)
    - 3. Consistent in Church (Worship, Fellowship, Service, Evangelism, Discipleship)


#### B. Set and Keep a Biblical Lifestyle
