Romans 5:8-11 "...but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. 9 Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. 10 For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. 11 More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation."

I Am _____ "...but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (v.8)

Rescue - "save (someone) from a dangerous or distressing situation"

- First responders rescue those in danger
- Heroes have to save the damsel in distress

Romans 3:23-24 "...for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, 24 and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus..."

Ezekiel 18:4 Behold, all souls are mine; the soul of the father as well as the soul of the son is mine: the soul who sins shall die.

I Am _____ "For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life." (v.10)

Colossians 1:21-22 "And you, who once were *alienated* and *hostile in mind, doing evil deeds*, he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him"

Reconciled - "to reestablish proper friendly interpersonal relations after these have been disrupted or broken"

2 Corinthians 5:18-19 "All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; 19 that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation."

I Will _____ "More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation." (v.11)

Rejoice (*kauchaomai*) - "to express an unusually high degree of confidence in someone or something being exceptionally noteworthy— **to boast**."

1 Corinthians 1:31 "...so that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

Hebrews 7:25 "Consequently, he is able to save to the uttermost those who draw near to God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them."
