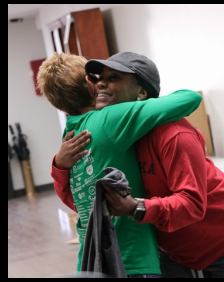

“The hospital was, in origin and conception, a distinctively Christian institution, rooted in Christian concepts of charity and philanthropy. What does the Bible say?

- Kneel down to honor
