1. Jesus was killed by crucifixion.

- Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John
- Tacitus
- Josephus

Death always the outcome

<u>Cicero</u> - "It is cruel and disgusting, so horrendous that the very word "cross" should be far removed not only from the person of a Roman citizen, but also from his thoughts, his eyes, and his ears."

Death always the outcome

Historian Dr. Michael Licona - "The fact that Jesus was crucified and died as a result, is as solid as anything in ancient history. The scholarly consensus across the board, from believers to atheists, is overwhelming. To deny it would be to take a position that would get you laughed out of the academic world."

2. Jesus' disciples believed He rose and appeared to them.

1 Corinthians 15:3–8 (NIV) For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born.

2. Jesus' disciples believed He rose and appeared to them.

- The Apostle Paul's testimony about the disciples.
- Written sources Gospels ... Apostolic Fathers
- Persecution and martyrdom proved they believed as fact

3. Antagonists converted and became Jesus' followers

Saul persecuted church ... transformed by personal encounter with risen Jesus

1 Corinthians 9:1 - "Am I not as free as anyone else? Am I not an apostle? Haven't I seen Jesus our Lord with my own eyes? Isn't it because of my work that you belong to the Lord?"

3. Antagonists converted and became Jesus' followers

Jesus' skeptical half-brother, James, converted to follow Jesus.

1 Corinthians 15:7 – "Then He appeared to James."

4. Jesus' tomb was empty.

- Jesus was publicly executed and buried in Jerusalem, then His resurrection was proclaimed in the very same city.
- Enemies created story of stolen body ... because tomb was empty!

The Reason for Hope

• Hope in Jesus' wisdom.

Matthew 7:24–25 (NIV) Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. ²⁵ The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock.

• Hope in Jesus' friendship.

Matthew 28:20 (NIV) And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

• Hope in Jesus' guidance.

Mt 11:28-29 Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.

• Hope in Jesus' sovereignty.

Philippians 2:9–11 (NIV) Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

• Hope in my future with Jesus.

1 Peter 1:3–4 (NIV) Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. This inheritance is kept in heaven for you...

Ecclesiastes 3:1-8, 11
