Philippians 2:1-5 (NIV)

Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, then make my joy complete by being likeminded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others. In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:



Philippians 2:1-5 (MSG)

If you've gotten anything at all out of following Christ, if his love has made any difference in your life, if being in a community of the Spirit means anything to you, if you have a heart, if you care— then do me a favor: Agree with each other, love each other, be deep-spirited friends. Don't push your way to the front; don't sweet-talk your way to the top. Put yourself aside, and help others get ahead. Don't be obsessed with getting your own advantage. Forget yourselves long enough to lend a helping hand. Think of yourselves the way Christ Jesus thought of himself.



Service

- Service is a heart stretching exercise.
- Service is when your <u>heart</u> stretches your <u>hands</u>, and you exhale the life God has given you.



3 Point Heart Check-up



1. We are <u>all</u> called to serve

- "For God called <u>you</u> to do good, even if it means suffering, just as Christ did. He is your example, and you must follow in His steps." - 1 Peter 2:21
- There are no spiritual scrubs.
- Don't mistake your position for your calling.



Ezekiel 37:4-6

Then he said to me, "Prophesy to these bones and say to them, 'Dry bones, hear the word of the Lord! This is what the Sovereign Lord says to these bones: I will make breath enter you, and you will come to life. I will attach tendons to you and make flesh come upon you and cover you with skin; I will put breath in you, and you will come to life. Then you will know that I am the Lord.' "

There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work. Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good.



1. We are <u>all</u> called to serve

- You will always feel dead if you keep acting like you are dead.
- "As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead." James 2:26 (NIV)



2. We serve because we are <u>part of the family</u>

- "How much more, then, will the blood of Christ cleanse our consciences from acts that lead to death, so that we may serve the living God!" – Hebrews 9:14
- We don't serve to gain salvation or to get God's attention!
- We serve because we love the family.
