...you shall <u>love</u> the Lord your God with all your **heart**, and with all your **soul**, and with all your **mind**, and with all your **strength**.



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

Emotion-filled Worship vs. Emotionalism


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- Emotionalism **gets**. Emotion-filled worship **gives**.



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- If we remove our emotions, worship becomes **partial** and **inauthentic**.

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- Joyful a feeling of joy with a focus of making an outward expression of joy.
