3. Worship Is Our Unashamed Gratitude

• 2 Samuel 6:16 - Then, as the ark of the Lord came into the City of David, Michal, Saul's daughter [David's wife], looked down from the window above and saw King David leaping and dancing before the Lord; and she felt contempt for him in her heart [because she thought him undignified].

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• 2 Samuel 6:20 - Then David returned to bless his household. But [his wife] Michal the daughter of Saul came out to meet David and said, "How glorious and distinguished was the king of Israel today, who uncovered himself and stripped [off his kingly robes] in the eyes of his servants' maids like one of the riffraff who shamelessly uncovers himself!"

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• 2 Samuel 6:22 - "David replied to Michal, "In God's presence I'll dance all I want! He chose me over your father and the rest of our family and made me prince over God's people, over Israel. Oh yes, I'll dance to God's glory-more recklessly even than this. And as far as I'm concerned . . . I'll gladly look like a fool."

"God gets some of his richest praise amidst dying groans, and he gets delightful music from his people's triumphant cries...to praise God, to give him the highest praise when we are in the deepest Waters...this is acceptable with him. The best worship comes from the Christian that is most tried, at least in this case, when the soul is most bowed down with trouble - if he can say I will praise him, I will praise him in the fire...it reaches the Majesty on high and God smiles and accepts it...

It's not your architecture, not your music, not your costumes...or your form but your hearts prostrate, your souls with unveiled faces worshiping the mysterious, the Unseen but everywhere present Great I Am...this is worship."

"No human force or direction can work the mysteries of God...if there is no wonder, no experience of mystery our efforts to worship will be futile. If God can be completely understood by our human means then I cannot worship Him. I will never bend my knee and say holy, holy, holy to that which I can figure out in my own mind. That which I can explain will never take me to a place of awe, wonder and astonishment.

Psalm 45:11 - "So the King will greatly desire your beauty;
 Because He is your Lord, worship Him."

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- Ephesians 5:32 "This is a great mystery, but it is an illustration of the way Christ and the church are one."



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- Exodus 33:9,11 As Moses went into the tent, the pillar of cloud would come down and stay at the entrance...the Lord would speak to Moses face to face, as one speaks to a friend.
- Exodus 33:10 Whenever the people saw the pillar of cloud standing at the entrance to the tent, they all stood and worshiped, each at the entrance to their tent

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- Hebrews 9:11-12; 10:19-22
 - So Christ has now become the High Priest...He has entered that greater, more perfect Tabernacle in heaven. With his own blood, he entered the Most Holy Place once for all time.
