To impact the world, you must believe that you have more than you need.

Jesus became poor so we could be rich

- "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich." 2 Corinthians 8:9
 - ...he was rich abounding in riches, wealthy.
 - "If I were hungry I would not tell you, for the world is mine, and all that is in it." Psalm 50:12
 - ...he became poor to become utterly poor, destitute, vulnerable "[Jesus]...emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant." Philippians 2:7
 - ...so you might become rich to be fully enriched, rich towards God

Poverty is a curse

"All these curses will come upon you. They will pursue you and overtake you until you are destroyed, because you did not obey the Lord your God and observe the commands and decrees he gave you. They will be a sign and a wonder to you and your descendants forever. Because you did not serve the Lord your God joyfully and gladly in the time of prosperity, therefore in **hunger** and **thirst**, in **nakedness** and dire poverty, you will serve the enemies the Lord sends against you." - Deuteronomy 28:45-48

Absolute Poverty is the curse we deserved

On the cross, Jesus was:

- Hungry.
- Thirsty.
- Naked.
- In dire poverty.

On the cross, absolute poverty was broken by Jesus!

Abundance
