The Space Shuttle Discovery was one of NASA's most famous and successful space shuttles. It was the third operational orbiter in the Space Shuttle program and first flew on August 30, 1984. Over its 27-year career, Discovery completed 39 missions — more than any other shuttle.

The Space Shuttle Challenger was NASA's second operational space shuttle orbiter. It first flew in 1983 and completed nine successful missions before being lost in the tragic Challenger disaster on January 28, 1986. The shuttle's final mission, STS-51-L, included teacher Christa McAuliffe as part of NASA's "Teacher in Space" program. Seventy-three seconds after liftoff, Challenger broke apart because cold temperatures caused a failure in an O-ring seal on one of the solid rocket boosters. All seven crew members were killed.
