

How the Holy Spirit Speaks to Us During Preaching:

- 1) The Preacher: Proclaims the Word in the power of the Holy Spirit.
- 2) The Spirit: Confirms in our hearts that the Word being preached is authentic.
- 3) The Congregation: The Spirit resounds within "Amen, it's true!" as we yield to application of the Word of God in our own hearts.

Spiritual Warm-Ups Before Hearing a Sermon	
1) Come with a sense of expectation	
and ask God for a hunger for His word. 2) Meditate on His greatness and worship Him.	
3) Pray for the preacher.	
4) Come with a rested body and an alert mind.	
5) Ask God for a teachable spirit.	

Spiritual Warm-Ups Before Hearing a Sermon

- 6) Ask God for faith.
- 7) Ask for a surrendered heart and give him your trust.
- 8) Ask for a heart that is ready to respond to the truth.
- 9) Seek opportunities to share the truth.
