<sup>19</sup> I know your works—your love, faithfulness, service, and endurance.I know that your last works are greater than the first.

#### Revelation 2:18-20 (CSB)

<sup>20</sup> But I have this against you: You tolerate the woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophetess and teaches and deceives my servants to commit sexual immorality...

#### Jude 4 (ESV)

For certain individuals whose condemnation was written about long ago have secretly slipped in among you. They are ungodly people, who pervert the grace of our God into a *license for immorality* and deny Jesus Christ our only Sovereign and Lord.

### Psalm 51:17 (CSB)

The sacrifice pleasing to God is a broken spirit. You will not despise a broken and humbled heart, God. Brokenness over sin is a sign that you are being sanctified.

**1 Corinthians 5:5 (CSB)** hand that one over to Satan for the destruction of the flesh, so that his spirit may be saved in the day of the Lord.

The Bible should not just be inspirational, but foundational.

**Sinners**: People who are not saved, who have not acknowledged Jesus as Lord of their lives, who have not asked for their sins to be forgiven. "Sin" is actually what defines them in the eyes of God. It is not they are uncapable of doing something generally good for themselves or others, but if they were to die, their sin would separate them from God forever on judgment day.

Saints: People who are saved by God, who have been set apart by Him to be holy forever. They have acknowledged that Jesus is the Lord of their lives, confessed their sins and their need for God to save them. The crucified Christ defines them in the eyes of God. It is not that they are incapable of still sinning, but if they were to die, their sin would not be held against them on judgement day.

If we allow and condone even just a little sin to be accepted in the church, it will spread and corrupt the whole church over time. Throughout the Bible, God was constantly asking his people to remove something sinful from a sacred space where God has chosen to live: The Garden of Eden, the tabernacle, the temple...and now the church.

#### 2 Corinthians 7:10 (NLT)

For the kind of *sorrow God wants* us to experience leads us *away from sin* and *results in salvation*. There's no regret for that kind of sorrow. But *worldly sorrow*, which *lacks repentance*, results in spiritual death.

## 1 Corinthians 5:11 (CSB)
