## 1 Corinthians 14:26-33 (CSB)

<sup>27</sup> If anyone speaks in another tongue, there are to be only two, or at the most three, each in turn, and let someone interpret.

<sup>28</sup> But if there is no interpreter, that person is to keep silent in the church and speak to himself and God.

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<sup>29</sup> Two or three prophets should speak, and the others should evaluate.
<sup>30</sup> But if something has been revealed to another person sitting there, the first prophet should be silent.




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## 1 Corinthians 14:26-33 (CSB)


31 For you can all prophesy one by one, so that everyone may learn and everyone may be encouraged.

"For the prophetical gifts remain with us, even to the present time."



"Others have foreknowledge of things to come: they see visions, and utter prophetic expressions. Others still, heal the sick by laying hands upon them...It is not possible to name the number of gifts which the church, (scattered) throughout the whole world, has received from God..."

"For, seeing that we acknowledge spiritual charistmata, or gifts, we too have merited the attainment of the prophetic gift..."

Prophecy today is when the Holy Spirit brings something to the mind of a believer to be shared with another believer.



Prophecy in the church today is not authoritative or on the same level as scripture.

The Apostle Paul said we should	
seek it and desire it. We should not despise it, even if we have seen it	
misused or abused in the church.

All believers have permission to	
prophesy, but according to the will	
of God, not all believers are gifted	-
with the ability to prophesy.	

God can speak to us prophetically about our future, but it is not "fortune telling."	
1 Corinthians 14:32-33 (CSB)  32 And the prophets' spirits are subject to the prophets,  33 since God is not a God of disorder but of peace.	
1) Prophecy should be conducted in a way that is orderly and peaceful.	

<b>1 Corinthians 14:29 (CSB)</b> Two or three prophets should speak, and the others should <b>evaluate</b> .

<sup>20</sup> Do not treat <b>prophecies</b>	-
with contempt <sup>21</sup> but <i>test</i> them all

2) While not everyone has the gift	
of prophecy, it seems that anyone	
with the Holy Spirit and knowledge	
of the Scriptures can <u>test</u> a prophetic word.	

1 Corinthians 13:9-12 (CSB) <sup>9</sup> For we know in part, and we prophesy in part, <sup>10</sup> but when the perfect comes, the partial will come to an end.

1 Carinthians 12:0 12 (CCR)	
1 Corinthians 13:9-12 (CSB)  11 When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put aside childish things.	
<sup>12</sup> For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror, but then face to face.

A) Does the prophetic message contradict what God has already	
communicated through His written word?	<u> </u>

1 Corinthians 14:37-38 (CSB)  37 If anyone thinks he is a prophet or spiritual, he should recognize that what I write to you is the Lord's command.  38 If anyone ignores this, he will be ignored.	
B) Is the prophetic word ultimately encouraging the church?	
C) Does the prophetic word maintain the order and flow of what God is already doing?	

1 Corinthians 14:29-30 (CSB) <sup>29</sup> Two or three prophets should speak, and the others should evaluate. <sup>30</sup> But if something has been revealed to another person sitting there, the first prophet should be silent.

D) Has the prophetic word been spoken from a place of <u>love</u> , or does it seem <u>self</u> -honoring or attention-seeking?	
<b>1 Corinthians 14:1 (CSB)</b> Pursue <i>love</i> and desire spiritual gifts,	
and especially that you may <b>prophesy</b> .
