Check-in

- 1. What lessons did you learn from your time in the Word this week?
- 2. What has God done in your life that's encouraging over the past 2 weeks?
- 3. Last week we talked about where we need to be stretched to grow as followers of Christ. Has God revealed any other areas where you need to be stretched this past week?

Scripture

Read Phillipians 1:12-20

Key Points From Message

- 1. The culture will oppose Christianity
- 2. God turns obstacles into opportunities
 - a. God creates personal opportunities for you to advance the gospel in the midst of the obstacles you're facing
 - b. God uses your perseverance through obstacles to motivate others in the gospel
- 3. The goal of the Christian life is that Christ is glorified in everything

Discover

- 1. What stands out to you in this passage of Scripture?
- 2. In verse 14 how does Paul describe how others are spreading the gospel due to his imprisonment?
- 3. In verse 18 Paul says, "what does it matter?" What is he referring to? What is his answer?
- 4. In verse 20 what is Paul's hope?

Deepen


- 1. What challenged you about this week's message?
- 2. In verse 13 we see that the whole imperial guard knew Paul was imprisoned because he was running after Jesus. Do the people you interact with everyday notice you are running after Jesus?
- 3. In verse 12 Paul explains that his imprisonment has helped to advance the gospel. In verse 14 we see that Paul's imprisonment has not just given him the opportunity to share the gospel, but it has given others confidence to share the gospel fearlessly. What opportunities are there to advance the gospel in the current obstacles you are facing?
- 4. How many people are motivated in their faith because they've watched your faith in action?

Discipleship Group Framework

D-group discussions in smaller gender-specific groups help to reveal our blind spots to sin. If this week is a D-group week, the discussions should be focused on confession of sins, providing accountability, and encouraging each other to live in the gospel. This time allows us to better evaluate our relationships, emotions, and circumstances.

Action Step

We live in a culture that tells us to do whatever feels right, that our happiness should be our primary motivation. The gospel tells us that our primary motivation should be to honor Christ with the way we live, work, and carry out our relationships. Examine what your primary motivation is throughout the day and identify any areas or situations where honoring Jesus is not the primary motivation.
