


Image Church Core Values

- 2. What does the text say about the character and nature of God?
- 3. What does the text say about the work of God?
- 4. What does the text say about our identity?
- 5. How does this change the way we live?

Deepen

- 1. What challenged you about this week's message?
- 2. What New Year's resolutions have you made this year?
- 3. As we start the new year are you more focused on "what's in it for you" this year or "what is God's will" this year?
- 4. Are you truly captivated by Christ? What else is trying to captivate you?
- 5. Do other people see you are captivated by Christ based on your interactions with them?
- 6. Are you being captivated by Christ and letting this compel you to do good works; or are you trying to compel yourself into being captivated by Him?
- 7. How can you show others who are looking to find completeness through relationships, employment, or identity that the only way to truly be complete is in Christ?
- 8. Do you need to pray and ask God to be captivated and compelled by Christ today?

Action Step

A new year is exciting because it's a chance for us to start over in different areas of our lives. Eating healthier, exercising more, or trying to start a new hobby are all good things. No matter what change we make in our lives, nothing except Jesus can change the fact that we are sinful people. How as a group can you encourage each other to be captivated, compelled, and remember you are complete in Christ? How as a group can you encourage others outside your community group? Discuss how you can remind each other of the love of God when trials arise throughout the year.
