Check-in

- 1. How are you doing with the changes due to COVID-19?
- 2. Is there anyone you know who could use assistance getting food or medicine?
- 3. Is there anyone you know who may be lonely or need encouragement due to the quarantine?

Scripture

Read John 11:1-44

Key Points From Message

Three things we have to understand to be able to answer how the resurrection shapes our view of the world

- 1. Death is evidence we live in a broken world
- 2. Jesus entered into our brokenness and it brought Him to tears
- 3. Jesus came to bring restoration to a broken world

How does the resurrection change the way that we view the broken reality we live in?

- 1. The resurrection changes the way we view our own brokenness
- 2. The resurrection changes the way we view the brokenness around us

Discover

- 1. Who is the author of this passage? Who is the target audience?
- 2. What stands out to you in this passage of Scripture?
- 3. Who was Lazarus?
- 4. What is different in how Mary and Martha address Jesus? What is similar?

Deepen

- 1. What challenged you about this week's message?
- 2. In verse 6 we see that Jesus stayed where he was for 2 days after finding out that Lazarus was sick before heading off to see him. This was because he had a greater purpose in mind so that God could be glorified. Is there an area of your life that you are expecting God to follow your timeline instead of His?
- 3. In verse 27 we see Martha tell Jesus that she believes He is the Messiah. In verse 21 she expresses unbelief in Jesus' ability to resurrect Lazarus prior to the last day. In verse 39 we see her express doubts when Jesus tells them to remove the stone. In what areas of your own life do you tend to doubt the power of Jesus?

- 4. How has the resurrection changed the way you view your own brokenness?
- 5. How has the resurrection changed the way you view the brokenness around you?

Action Step

Evaluate how the resurrection has changed the way you view your own brokenness and the brokenness around you. Does the brokenness of the world dilute how you view the love of God? Focus on measuring the love of God by the cross and not by your current or past circumstances. Share with your community group how you struggle with understanding and believing the love of God.
