Discussion Questions

- 1. Please review the sermon outline, adding insightful comments as you do so.
- 2. Take a few moments to pray and thank God for His forgiveness and grace in your life. If you are alone you may want to be specific about the things for which He has forgiven you and for which he has given you grace.
- 3. Now spend a few minutes asking God if there is anyone you need to forgive and to whom you need to extend grace. Be sure to listen for His answers.
- 4. Why is it so hard to extend forgiveness and grace to those WE think don't deserve it?
- 5. Read John 8:1-11, imagining the women's sin to be one that you find particularly heinous other than adultery. Does that change how you view the story? Why or why not? What sins do you think are the hardest to forgive? Why? (Were you thinking of YOUR sins or someone else's sins?)
- 6. What do you think happened after Jesus forgave the woman caught in adultery? Do you think she changed her lifestyle? Why or why not? How do you think Jesus' forgiveness affected the crowd of onlookers? How do you think it affected Jesus?
- 7. Read Lk. 19:7,8. How do you think the "grumblers" of v. 7 responded to Zaccheus' actions described in v. 8?
