- 4. Read Jn. 10:27-29 and Rom. 8:38,39. What do these passages teach about the inability to lose one's salvation?

5. Look up and discuss what the following passages of Scripture teach, noting that if it were possible to "lose" your salvation then it would also require you: to become un-sealed with the Holy Spirit (Eph. 4:30), to become un-indwelt by the Holy Spirit (Rom. 8:9), to become un-baptized by the Holy Spirit (1 Cor. 12:13), to become severed from the Body of Christ (1 Cor. 12:13), to become un-born again (Jn. 3:3), to become un-crucified with Christ (Gal. 2:20), to become un-new creations (2 Cor. 5:17), to become un-predestined, dis-inherited and un-adopted by God (Eph. 1:3-5), to go from being God's child to being His enemy (Jn. 1:12; Rom. 5:10), to be spiritually killed after having been made spiritually alive (Eph. 2:5), and to lose eternal life after having once obtained it (Jn. 3:16)!
