Discussion Questions

- 1. Have you ever needed to be rescued? If so, describe your experience and how you felt after you had been rescued.
- 2. Close your eyes and picture Jesus. What do you see? Why do you think you picture Jesus this way?
- 3. When you picture Jesus, do you see Him more as a man or as God? Explain your answer.
- 4. Read Phil. 2:5-8. Jesus's suffering and death provide salvation for mankind, but what do you think personally motivated Jesus to be willing to suffer and die for mankind? What does His motivation for His actions say about how He feels about you?
- 5. Read John 8:55-58. People often overlook (or are ignorant of) the fact that Jesus, like the other two Members of the Holy Trinity, has always existed. Why do you think that this obvious truth (since Jesus is God) is so overlooked? What difference should this truth make in your life?
- 6. Because Jesus is God, He has always existed. Do you know how Jesus "showed up" in the Old Testament since He hadn't yet taken on human flesh? Provide scriptural support if you are able to. (Hint: Many theologians believe that "the angel of the Lord" in the O.T. is Jesus appearing in the form of an angel.) How did people respond to Jesus in the O.T.? Why should our response be different?
- 7. Since Jesus is God, what does that mean in terms of His ability to understand you, to help you, to provide for you, to guide you, and to save you?
