Principle 1:

The Purpose of
Prayer

1 Corinthians 2:9-10

But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him. 10

But God hath revealed [them] unto us by his Spirit: for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God.

1 Corinthians 2:11

For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him? even so the things of God knoweth no man, but the Spirit of God

The Place of
Prayer

Luke 5:15-16

But so much the more went there a fame abroad of him: and great multitudes came together to hear, and to be healed by him of their infirmities.
16 And he withdrew himself into the wilderness, and prayed.

Daniel 6:10

Principle 3:

The Presence of
Prayer

Prayer is not a
monologue – it is
a meeting

Psalm 16:11

Thou wilt shew me the path of
life: in thy presence [is] fulness
of joy; at thy right hand [there
are] pleasures for evermore.

James 4:8

Draw nigh to God, and he will
draw nigh to you. Cleanse [your]
hands, [ye] sinners; and purify
[your] hearts, [ye] double minded.

You are not praying
to God – you are
praying with God

Romans 8:15-16

For ye have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father. 16 The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God:

When you shift from
praying to God to praying
with God – prayer stops
being a religious routine
and becomes a living
relationship.

If we are going to
experience the presence
of God in prayer – it will
require more than
speaking—it will require
silence
