

Reckless: without thinking or caring about the consequences of an action

Principle #1: This Appointment is Intentional

John 4:4
And he must needs go through Samaria

The phrase "must needs go through Samaria" is not a physical or geographic necessity: Jesus had a divine appointment in Samaria

Jesus intentionally walked through the very place the Jews avoided

There is a moment in your life in which you must decide to stop letting people dictate what you do and don't do

 Never allow the expectations of others make you into someone you were never meant to be

God is preparing you for a divine appointment

Even though this woman wasn't seeking God - God was seeking her

Psalm 37:23

The steps of a [good] man are ordered by the LORD: and he delighteth in his way.

Romans 8:28

And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to [his] purpose.

Psalm 31:14-15

But I trusted in thee, O LORD: I said, Thou [art] my God. 15 My times [are] in thy hand

God is intentionally walking through your Samaria

Principle #2: This Appointment is Transformational

John 4:10

Jesus answered and said unto her, If thou knewest the gift of God, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldest have asked of him, and he would have given thee living water.

If you only knew...

- If you only knew what God could do for you
- If you only knew the plans that God has for you
- If you only knew how much God wanted to do in your life
- If you only knew the potential that lay deep within you

What stood in the way of this woman's revelation?

John 4:11

The woman saith unto him, Sir, thou hast nothing to draw with, and the well is deep: from whence then hast thou that living water?

1: She was thinking in the natural instead of the supernatural

• You cannot limit what God can do in your life just because you can't figure it out

John 4:12

Art thou greater than our father Jacob, which gave us the well, and drank thereof himself, and his children, and his cattle?

2: She thought in the realm of history rather than destiny

- As long as you are tied to your history you will never be able to reach your destiny
- Jesus came to break her history and lead her into her destiny

John 4:10

Jesus answered and said unto her, If thou knewest the gift of God, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink

A greater revelation of the Person of Christ will always bring a greater revelation of the Power of Christ

Principle #3: This Appointment is Confrontational

John 4:15-18

The woman saith unto him, Sir, give me this water, that I thirst not, neither come hither to draw. 16 Jesus saith unto her, Go, call thy husband, and come hither. 17 The woman answered and said, I have no husband. Jesus said unto her, Thou hast well said, I have no husband: 18 For thou hast had five husbands; and he whom thou now hast is not thy husband: in that saidst thou truly.

This divine appointment was not just to inspire this woman about the potential of her future – this appointment was to invoke this woman to deal with the pitfalls of her present

You will never conquer anything you are not willing to confront
