

Sermon Outline: Built to Last - Week 4: Activate (Big Vision Sunday)

I. Introduction

- Recap of the series: Examining John, Peter, Philip, and others.
- Transition to Joshua: Learning from his leadership in fulfilling God's mission.

II. Core Belief

- We believe in activating believers to pursue God's mission, helping others to grow in this ongoing process.
- The Great Commission (Matthew 28:19) as our mission objective.
- Analogy: Mission Impossible seemingly impossible missions are achievable with God.

III. Joshua's Call to Leadership (Joshua 1:7)

- God's charge to Joshua: Be strong and courageous, follow the law.
- The importance of remembering how they got there.
- Joshua's immediate steps: preparing to move forward.

IV. Rahab and God's Unexpected Allies (Joshua 2)

- Joshua sends spies to Jericho; the king seeks to eliminate them.
- Rahab's faith and assistance despite her background.
- Recognition of God's power (Joshua 2:10-11).
- Spies' report: The land is already in God's hands (Joshua 2:24).

V. Stepping Forward in Faith (Joshua 3)

- Joshua does not rush into battle but seeks God's direction.
- The Jordan River: A natural barrier, but God provides a way.
- Instruction to the priests to carry the Ark and step into the waters (Joshua 3:8).
- The miraculous crossing: A new generation witnessing God's power.

VI. Remembering God's Faithfulness (Joshua 4:20-24)

- The memorial of twelve stones at Gilgal.
- Teaching future generations about God's provision.
- Parallel to our own spiritual journey: Once lost in sin, now crossing into God's promises.

VII. Key Lessons from Joshua's Leadership

- 1. Joshua waited for God's direction.
- 2. Preparation is essential before stepping into God's promises.
- 3. God provides allies in unexpected places.
- 4. Patience and obedience lead to miracles.
- 5. Those who serve (priests) led the way, not just Joshua.
- 6. Remembrance is crucial for sustained faith and vision.

VIII. Application: Activation in Our Lives

- Even in the Promised land, there are still battles to be fought.
- The significance of the scarlet rope: Salvation is for all who respond in faith (Joshua 2:12-13).
- Our responsibility to take the message of salvation to those still on the other side.
- Call to action: It's time to activate and move forward in God's mission.
