

Week 6 – Letters to the Thessalonians

Worthy of His Kingdom

Introduction

- Living in the hope of Christ's return gives us encouragement in the day-to-day struggles of life.
- The human experience is messy—personalities clash, flaws show, and we all carry wounds.
- Like a flesh wound, spiritual wounds need urgent care: Stop the Bleed.

1. Endurance & Faithfulness in Persecution

- 2 Thessalonians 1:3-5
 - Paul thanks God for the Thessalonians' flourishing faith and growing love.
 - He proudly tells other churches of their endurance and faithfulness.
 - Growth and maturity never happen by accident; they are forged in adversity.
 - **Oswald Chambers:** Choosing God's will—even if it means suffering—aligns us with Christ's example.

Truth: Hope shines brightest when it is tested.

2. God's Justice in a Broken World

- 2 Thessalonians 1:6–9
 - God will bring justice to those who persecute His people.
 - Faith isn't forged by avoiding hardship but through standing firm in it.
 - Jesus said, "The Kingdom of Heaven suffereth violence, and the violent take it by force"—the Kingdom keeps advancing despite resistance.
 - Our endurance and faithfulness become our testimony that we belong to His Kingdom.
- Truth: Justice may not be seen in our lifetime, but God's judgment will be final and perfect.

3. Rest for the Faithful, Fire for the Unfaithful

- 2 Thessalonians 1:7–10
 - Christ will return in flaming fire with His angels—bringing both rest for the faithful and judgment for the rebellious.
 - Illustration: Wildfires & backburn—controlled fire protects against greater destruction.
 - God's people endure fire now so that when the final fire comes, they are secure in Him.
- Truth: Enduring fire today prepares us for glory tomorrow.

4. A Prayer for Worthy Living

- 2 Thessalonians 1:11–12
 - Paul's prayer for the church:
 - 1. Live worthy of His call (salvation, not just vocation).
 - 2. **Fulfill His purpose** through Spirit-led works.

- 3. **Live so that Jesus is glorified**—His glory shining through us, like Moses (Ex. 34) or Stephen (Acts 6).
- Character is revealed in what we do when no one is watching (John Wooden).
- Truth: Our lives should radiate Christ's glory until He returns.

5. The Final Judgment

- Revelation 20:11–15
 - The great white throne judgment: all will be judged according to their deeds.
 - Those not found in the Book of Life face eternal separation from God.
 - Those in Christ will share in His glory forever.

Conclusion

- Hope in Christ's return encourages us to:
 - Endure trials faithfully.
 - Trust God's justice.
 - Rest in His promise.
 - Live in such a way that His glory radiates from us.

→ Main Takeaway: The hope of Christ's return stops the bleed, strengthens our endurance, and ensures that His glory will be revealed in us.
