Opening Thought

The resurrection is familiar—but for those who lived it, it was the most difficult and **निर्णायक** moment of their lives.

Gospel of Mark 11:9–10

“Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord...”

1. The Problem Hasn’t Changed

Ecclesiastes 1:9

- Humanity continues to drift from God
- Sin is not new—it is constant

Biblical Pattern:

- Genesis → Flood
- Exodus → Wandering
- Judges → Cycles of sin
- Kings → Exile
- Mark → Roman oppression

 Key Thought:

Sin isn't a modern issue—it is the repeating condition of mankind.

2. The Battle Hasn't Changed

 Mark 11 (Fig Tree / Temple)

 Genesis 3:15

 Mark 12:36

 Mark 14:1

- The real battle is not external—it is internal
- Jesus came to deal with sin in the heart

 Mark 14:38

"The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."

 Key Thought:

We often fight the wrong enemy—Jesus came to defeat sin.

3. The Solution Hasn't Changed

- Sin cannot be overcome by:
 - Church attendance
 - Good works
 - Religious effort
- Even the disciples failed
- Even Peter fell short

 Key Thought:

Effort cannot remove sin—only Jesus can.

4. The Response Hasn't Changed

 The Cross & Resurrection

- Jesus took the full weight of sin
- We are called to submit, not self-correct

 Mark 16:16

"Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved..."



Key Thought:

Salvation comes through belief in Christ alone.
