

Sermon Outline: Built to Last - Week 2

Introduction

- Transitioning from believer to disciple is challenging.
- Many connect with Jesus or get baptized but struggle afterward.
- The miracle of salvation is a **change in the heart**, not just words or actions.
- 2 Corinthians 5:17 Becoming a new creation in Christ is a process.

Core Belief

 We desire to cultivate strong disciples through Bible-centered preaching, teaching, and worship.

I. What Does It Mean to Cultivate?

- Definition of Cultivate:
 - o Prepare for use.
 - o Foster growth.
 - o Improve by labor, care, or study.
- **A.W. Tozer**: "The unattended garden will soon be overrun with weeds; the heart that fails to cultivate truth will shortly be a theological wilderness."

II. The Challenge of Discipleship

- Salvation cannot be earned; it was finished at the cross.
- Partnering with Jesus requires intentionality and understanding.

A. Jesus' Early Ministry

- Leading to John 6, the disciples witnessed:
 - o Prophecies.
 - Water turned to wine.
 - o Temple cleansing.
 - o Conversations with Nicodemus and the Samaritan woman.
 - Various healings.
- **John 6**: Feeding 5,000 (1-13), walking on water (16-21), teaching on communion.
- John 6:60-66: Many disciples turned away when faced with hard truths.

III. The Cost of Following Jesus

• Jesus never promised an easy road.

A. It May Cost Family

Mark 3:31-33 – Redefining family.

B. It May Cost Security

• Matthew 8:22 (Luke 9:59-62) – Following without conditions.

C. It May Cost Life

• Matthew 10:37-39 – Taking up your cross.

D. Sacrifices Are Not in Vain

• Matthew 11:28-30 – Rest for the weary.

E. The Cost of Discipleship distinguishes it from just acknowledgement

IV. Love, Acceptance, and Forgiveness

- The world redefines these terms, but Scripture provides clarity:
- Book by Jerry Cook with Stanley C Baldwin
- Love is not a license

- Acceptance is not Agreement
- Forgiveness is not Compromise

1. Love Is Receiving Correction

- **Proverbs 3:11-12** The Lord disciplines those He loves.
- **Hebrews 12:5-6** Discipline is a sign of God's love.

2. Acceptance Is Cutting Away our Sinful nature

• Colossians 2:10-14 – Spiritual circumcision: removing sinful nature.

3. Forgiveness Is Making Room for Something Beautiful

- **Hebrews 6:7-8** Fruitful cultivation brings blessing; neglect brings judgment.
- Ezekiel 36:33-35 God's cleansing transforms desolate places into fruitful gardens.

Conclusion

- Cultivation is an active process that distinguishes a true disciple from a mere believer.
- Commitment to Christ may cost greatly, but it leads to a transformed life filled with God's blessings.
