Big Idea

Christmas Truth:

1. Faithfulness Matters

Our everyday faithfulness has eternal impact

- George stayed when he wanted to leave
- Faithfulness often feels unnoticed

God formed us intentionally and planned our days—nothing is accidental.

2. Created on Purpose

God uses our lives in ways we rarely recognize

- George sees how his small choices changed lives

 **1 Corinthians 3:5–7**

We plant and water—God brings the growth.

3. Your Life Matters

Even when you feel insignificant, God says you matter

 **Jeremiah 29:11**

God's plans bring hope and a future—even in hard seasons.

 **Ephesians 2:10**

We are God's handiwork, created on purpose.

4. Jesus Changes Everything

True joy is found in Christ

 **Luke 2:8–14**

Jesus brings good news of great joy for all people.

- Your past is redeemed
- Your present has purpose
- Your future is secure
