1. Two Kingdoms on Display (*Mark 6*)

- Jesus rejected in Nazareth (6:6)
 - Disciples sent out with authority
 - John the Baptist's death (6:14–29)
 - Contrast: Herod's palace vs. the wilderness
 - Jesus moved with compassion (6:34)
 - Feeding of the 5,000 (6:35–44)

2. One Question That Changes Everything (*Mark 6–8*)

- Miracles reveal Jesus' authority and identity
 - Walking on water (6:45–52)
 - Healings and deliverance (Ch. 7)
 - Feeding of the 4,000 (8:1–10)
- Jesus confronts religious misunderstanding
- The question: "*Who do you say that I am?*" (8:29)
- Peter's confession and correction (8:29–33)

3. The Call to Follow (*Mark 8–10*)

- Deny yourself, take up your cross (8:34–36)
- The Transfiguration (9:2–8)
- “Lord, I believe; help my unbelief” (9:24)
- Servanthood over status (9:35)
- The rich young ruler (10:17–22)
- True greatness defined (10:43–45)

Closing: The King Who Came to Serve (*Mark 11:1–10*)

- Triumphal entry on a donkey
- Fulfillment of prophecy (Zechariah 9:9)
- A humble King on the road to the cross
