II. Guard Your Freedom

Galatians 5:1-6

- Don't return to slavery through the law or works
- Circumcision vs. faith: outward symbols do not bring salvation
- The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love

"You who are trying to be justified by the law have been alienated from Christ; you have fallen away from grace." (Gal. 5:4)

III. The Weight of Bondage: Denver's Story

- From Same Kind of Different As Me
- Denver's poverty, isolation, and lack of opportunity reflect spiritual slavery
- True freedom is not just knowing there's a train out—but having the courage to jump on it

"I didn't know that I was free..." — Denver Moore

➤ Many people are stuck spiritually because they don't know another way exists

IV. Who Cut in on You?

- Galatians 5:7–10
 - The danger of spiritual leaven (false teaching, legalism)
 - A little compromise spoils the whole loaf
 - → like yeast, it grows and spoils if not kept in check
 - Jesus also warned of the yeast of the Pharisees (Luke 12:1)

"A little leaven leavens the whole lump." (Gal. 5:9)

V. The Offense of the Cross

- Galatians 5:11
 - The Cross demands surrender, not self-effort
 - E.M. Bounds: "All God's plans have the mark of the Cross on them... death to self"

VI. Freedom to Serve in Love

- **Galatians 5:13–15**
 - True liberty is not selfish—it's self-giving
 - Love your neighbor as yourself

 Avoid biting and devouring each other—selfish freedom leads to destruction

"Do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh..."

VII. The Spirit vs. The Flesh

- Galatians 5:16–21
 - Two opposing forces:
 - Flesh: evident in works like hatred, wrath, selfishness
 - Spirit: leads to life and peace
 - We can't pick and choose which "flesh issues" to ignore

"Those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God."

(Already/Not Yet Kingdom tension)

VIII. The Fruit of the Spirit

Galatians 5:22–24

• Godward: Love, Joy, Peace

Manward: Patience, Kindness, Goodness

• Selfward: Faithfulness, Gentleness, Self-Control

- "Against such things there is no law."
- \rightarrow These qualities don't need regulation—they fulfill the Law naturally

IX. Walk in the Spirit

- Galatians 5:25
 - Freedom must be lived out
 - Walking in the Spirit is more than belief—it's behavior

X. Closing Story: A Million Peso Freedom

- General Simón Bolívar freed all slaves in Peru using his reward money
- Why free a nation if the people still live in chains?

"It is for freedom that Christ set us free..." (Gal. 5:1)
