

ACT(ion)S - No Other Name Acts Week 2

Acts References: Most are NIV

- 1. Acts 2:46-47 The believers meeting daily, breaking bread, and the Lord adding to their number.
- 2. Acts 3:1 Peter and John going to the temple at the hour of prayer.
- 3. Acts 3:2-5 The lame man at the Beautiful Gate begging for alms.
- 4. Acts 3:6-7 Peter heals the man in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth.
- 5. Acts 3:8-9 The man walking, leaping, and praising God in the temple.
- 6. Acts 3:10-11 The people recognize him and gather at Solomon's Colonnade.
- 7. Acts 3:12-16 Peter addresses the crowd, emphasizing Jesus' power and resurrection.
- 8. Acts 4:4 The number of believers grows to about five thousand.
- 9. Acts 4:10 Peter speaks before the Sanhedrin, proclaiming Jesus' resurrection.
- 10. Acts 4:11 Jesus as the cornerstone, quoting Psalm 118:22.
- 11. Acts 4:12 Salvation found in no other name but Jesus.

Other Scripture References:

- 12. **Daniel 6:10** Daniel praying three times a day facing Jerusalem.
- 13. Luke 2:46 Jesus as a child in the temple courts, discussing with the teachers.
- 14. **Psalm 118:22** "The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone" (referenced in Acts 4:11).

Introduction

- The birth of the Church through unity and the Holy Spirit.
- Comparing Acts to the Revolutionary War A few people with a common purpose led to worldwide impact.
- Just as colonists met at the **Old South Meeting House**, the early believers gathered, while others put their **faith into action**.

I. The Church Growing Daily (Acts 2:46-47)

- Early believers met daily in homes and in the temple.
- Acts 2:46-47 "The Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved."
- This could refer to Luke's daily account or what continued happening over time.
- Key Thought: The movement of God grows through faithful obedience and action.

II. No Other Name – The Power of Jesus (Acts 3:1-16)

- 1. Peter & John's Faithful Prayer Life (Acts 3:1)
 - They went to the temple for prayer, following Jewish tradition.
 - o Daniel 6:10 Daniel prayed three times a day, facing Jerusalem.
- 2. The Lame Beggar's Encounter (Acts 3:2-5)
 - A man crippled from birth was begging at the Beautiful Gate.
 - He asked for money, but he needed a miracle.
- 3. A Divine Appointment The Healing in Jesus' Name (Acts 3:6-7)
 - Peter & John looked him in the eye and extended faith, not finances.
 - "Silver and gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." (Acts 3:6)
 - Key Thought: Miracles happen not because of our resources, but because of Jesus' authority.
- 4. Transformation & Praise (Acts 3:8-10)
 - The man jumped up, walked, and praised God.
 - The miracle **astonished the crowd** and led to an opportunity to share Jesus.
 - Key Thought: The purpose of miracles is to glorify God and lead others to salvation.

III. The Purpose Behind the Miracle (Acts 3:11-16)

- 1. Peter Seizes the Opportunity (Acts 3:12-13)
 - He refocuses attention from himself to Jesus.
 - "Why do you stare at us as if by our own power or godliness we made this man walk?"
 - **Key Thought:** Miracles point to Jesus, not man.
- 2. Peter Confronts Their Rejection of Jesus (Acts 3:14-15)
 - They rejected Jesus and demanded a murderer instead.
 - Yet, God raised Jesus from the dead, and they were witnesses.
- 3. The Power of Faith in Jesus (Acts 3:16)
 - "By faith in the name of Jesus, this man whom you see and know was made strong."
 - Key Thought: It is Jesus' name and faith in Him that brings true healing and restoration.

IV. Opposition & Boldness – No Other Name (Acts 4:4-12)

- 1. The Church Grows Despite Persecution (Acts 4:4)
 - Many who heard Peter's message believed, and the number grew to 5,000 men.
 - Key Thought: The gospel advances even when opposed.
- 2. Peter's Defense Before the Sanhedrin (Acts 4:10-12)
 - Acts 4:10 Peter boldly declares Jesus' resurrection and the healing in His name.
 - o Acts 4:11 Quotes Psalm 118:22 Jesus, the cornerstone rejected by men.
 - Acts 4:12 "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved."
- 3. Key Thought: The name of Jesus is exclusive in salvation and powerful in authority.

V. Application - Faith in Action

- Not about Silver & Gold, but Jesus (Acts 3:6)
 - We may not always have physical resources, but we carry the name of Jesus.
- Faith in Action Opens Doors (Acts 3:10-12)
 - Our encounters should lead others to wonder and amazement at God.
- Boldness in the Face of Opposition (Acts 4:12)
 - We must **stand firm** in proclaiming the name of Jesus.

Conclusion - The Cycle of Glory

- The Holy Spirit glorifies Jesus,
- Jesus glorifies the Father.
- The Father gives the Holy Spirit,
- The Holy Spirit **empowers us to glorify Jesus**.
