Jesus is the Rock, the first and great foundation of the Church (1 Corinthians 3:11; See also 1 Peter 2:4-10).



- Nowhere in Scripture is it stated that Peter would be the supreme and infallible authority above all other disciples (Acts 15; Gal. 2:11).
- ▲ The Laying of the Foundation of the Local Church: 7
  - I Corinthians 3:5-14 "As a wise master builder I have laid the foundation, and another builds on it. But let each one take heed how he builds on it. For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ."
  - The Church is the product of God's divine working: Born and Baptized of the Holy Spirit (Hebrews 12:23; 1 Corinthians 12:13).





- ✤ <u>Early Church Fathers</u>: Clement, Ignatius, Polycarp, Tertullian, Athanasius, Eusebius, Didymus, Ambrose, Jerome, John Chrysostom, <sup>8</sup> Irenaeus, Justin Martyr, John Calvin, Martin Luther, John & Charles Wesley... to name a few.
- ★ <u>The Patristic Era</u>: c. AD 100-451 (A period of persecution by the Roman Empire; The establishment of the Roman Catholic Church)
- ★ <u>The Middle Ages</u>: c. AD 476-1517 (A period of formality and institutionalism; The Papacy; The secularization of the Church)
- ✤ <u>The 16<sup>th</sup> Century</u>: c. AD 1500-1599 (A period of the emergence of great reformers: Martin Luther, Huldreich Zwingli, John Calvin.)
- ✤ <u>The Renaissance</u>: c. AD 1400 1600 (A period of European cultural, artistic, political and economic "rebirth" following the Middle Ages.)<sup>9</sup>

#### **Rediscovering The Church**

▲ It is vitally important it is for us to <u>reflect</u> <u>the values</u> of Jesus and be about <u>the</u> <u>mission of Christ</u> as the Church.



#### The Foundation of the New Testament Church

- ✤ Review:
  - The founding of the Church ~ it's origin = The Day of Pentecost!
  - ✤ Jesus spent quality time explaining to the Disciples about the foundation of the Church.
- ✤ Today's Focus: What did Jesus teach about the Foundation of the Church and how can we compare this to the historical account of the Church to gauge where we are today as the Church.
- ✤ Scriptures: Matthew 16:13-20 ~ Jesus' teaching on the foundation of the Church. [See Also Mark 8:27-30; Luke 9:18-21]

Son of Man, am? ... But who do you say that I am?"



- Simon Peter ~ "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God!"
- Sesus ~ "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah, for flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but My Father who is in heaven. And I also say to you that you are Peter [petros], and on this rock [petra] I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it."

✤ <u>The Foundation</u>: <sup>1</sup>

- $\clubsuit$  The Church is the Lord's: He called it "My Church".
- The Church was purchased with His own blood (Acts 20:28).
- The Head of the Church is Jesus Christ He is "the cornerstone" of the Church (Ephesians 2:20; 5:23; Colossians 1:18; Revelation 1:12-20; 2:5, 16).
- $\blacksquare$  <u>Varying Views</u>: On who or what "this" rock is (Matthew 16:18). <sup>2</sup>
  - View #1 Some hold that it refers to Peter.
  - View #2 Some suggest that it refers to the Apostles.
  - ♦ View #3 Others feel that it refers to Christ Himself.
  - ♥ View #4 There are others who refer it to Peter's Confession.
  - Henry Thiessen: "Whatever position one might take on this debated subject, <u>three things are clear</u>: Christ is building his church, He is using human instruments, and these human instruments must confess to the deity of Jesus Christ." <sup>3</sup>
- ▶ <u>Pastor Mark's Take</u>: A Combination of View #3 and #4. <sup>4</sup>
  - ✤ John 1:40-42 Jesus changes Simon's name: Cephas (a stone).
  - 🗞 Matthew 16:18 Jesus calls Simon "Peter": **Petros** (a stone, pebble).
  - ♥ But then says: "Upon this rock: Petra (massive solid bedrock; boulder) I will build My church. <sup>56</sup>

- The Post-Reformation: c. AD 1517 Present (A period of varied applications of NT Christianity by individuals and organizations.)
  - The Era of Rationalism: c. AD 1600 1799 (A period of intellectual and philosophical movements that prepared the stage for many of the liberal and sometimes antispiritual teachings of the 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup> Centuries.)
  - Spiritual Movements: c. AD 1600 1999 (A co-existing period of movements reacting to the stifling and liberalizing tendencies of Rationalism that have once more **yearned for and received a genuine experience with God:** The Pietist movement [17<sup>th</sup> Century], The Moravian & Methodist movements [18<sup>th</sup> Century], The Great Awakenings, Holiness movement, and the **Pentecostal movement** [18<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> Centuries]). <sup>10</sup>

#### <u>The Church Founded by Jesus Christ Is ALIVE & WELL,</u> <u>And Shall Continue To Progress Until He Comes!</u>
