BIBLICAL METAPHORS (Continued...)

<u>★ The Temple of God</u>

- "A temple is a place in which God, who dwells everywhere, localizes Himself in one particular place where His people may always find Him 'at home.' "3 (Exodus 25:8; 1 Kings 8:27)
- As God dwelt in the tabernacle and temple, so He now lives, by His Spirit, in the church (1 Peter 2:4-6; Ephesians 2:19-22; 1 Corinthians 3:16-17).
- In this spiritual temple Christians, <u>as priests</u>, offer up spiritual sacrifices sacrifices of prayer, praise and good works. ⁴
- ➡ <u>Biblical Components of the Temple:</u>
 - A Solid Foundation (1 Corinthians 3:11; Ephesians 2:20).
 - A Cornerstone (Ephesians 2:20-21; 1 Peter 2:6-7).
 - ★ Living Stones (1 Peter 2:5; Ephesians 2:21-22).



We are the temple of the <u>Holy Spirit!</u> (1 Corinthians 3:16-17; 6:19) [hieron – whole temple / naos – the inner sanctuary]


A Plethora of Other Metaphors

 - ☆ "We are his house" (Hebrews 3:6).
 - * "With Jesus Christ himself viewed as the 'builder' of the house" (Hebrews 3:3).
 - ☆ "The church is also viewed as 'a pillar and buttress of the truth' " (1 Timothy 3:15). 5
- ♦ A flock (John 10:1-18; Hebrews 13:20; 1 Peter 2:25). ⁶
- ♦ A harvest (Matthew 13:1–30; John 4:35). ⁷




ECCLESIOLOGY ~ "The Doctrine of the New Testament Church"

Review:

- ₩ What the Church IS and IS NOT.
 - ♦ The Church is not synonymous with Israel.
 - ♦ The Church is not synonymous with the Kingdom of God.
 - However, She is a vital part of the Kingdom of God.
- ₱ Biblical Metaphors:
 - The Kingdom of God / The Kingdom of Heaven (Mark 4:30; Luke 13:18).
 - ♦ The Family of God (1 Timothy 5:1-2; Matthew 12:47-50; 1 John 3:14-18; Ephesians 3:14; 2 Corinthians 6:18)
 - ♦ The Bride of Christ (Ephesians 5:24f., 32; 2 Corinthians 11:2; James 4:4; Revelation 19:6 -20:6; 21:2; 22:17; John 3:29).

BIBLICAL METAPHORS

★ The Body of Christ

- A Favorite Metaphor of the Apostle Paul (Romans 12:4; 1 Cor. 12:12-27; Ephesians 1:22f.; 3:6; 4:4, 12, 16; 5:23, 30; Colossians 1:18, 24; 2:19; 3:15). 1
- This metaphor gives us a tangible picture of what the Church is designed to be – A Body / An Organism.
 - ☆ The Body is a Unit, Made up of Many Parts (1 Cor. 12:12-13).
 - ☆ The Spirit works in all of them for the common good (1 Cor.) 12:4-7).
 - Therefore, there should be no division in the body (1 Cor. 12:25; Romans 12:5).
- The <u>unity</u> of this Body indwelt by the Holy Spirit is a divine mystery. Some keys to this unity are:
 - ☆ Loving one another we are told to increase in this love.
 - ☆ Humility not thinking more highly of ourselves.
 - ☆ Serving one another putting others before yourself.
 - ☆ Self-sacrifice as Jesus gave us the ultimate example.
- There is a necessary <u>diversity</u> if the body of Christ is to function properly. ²
 - Now the body is not made up of one part, but of many" (1 Cor. 12:14-26). [e.g., foot, hand, ear, eye, nose...]
 - * "Each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function." (Romans 12:4). [e.g., prophecy, ministry, teaching, exhortation, giving, leading, mercy...]
- ♦ Jesus is the Head of the Body - The Head of the Church.
 - ☆ Ephesians 1:22-23; 4:15-16: Colossians 2:18-19



APPLICATION:

"Each of the metaphors used for the church can help us to appreciate more of the richness of privilege that God has given us by incorporating us into the church."

- $f \Psi$ "The fact that the church is like <u>a family</u> should increase our love and fellowship with one another."
- "The thought that the church is like the bride of Christ should stimulate
 us to strive for greater purity, holiness, love for Christ, and submission
 to him."
- "The image of the church <u>as branches in a vine</u> should cause us to rest in him more fully."
- ▼ "The idea of <u>an agricultural crop</u> should encourage us to continue growing in the Christian life and obtaining for ourselves and others the proper spiritual nutrients to grow."
- "The picture of the church as <u>God's new temple</u> should increase our awareness of God's very presence dwelling in our midst as we meet."
- "The concept of the church as a priesthood should help us to see more clearly the delight God has in the sacrifices of praise and good deeds that we offer to him (see Heb. 13:15–16)."
- "The metaphor of the church as the body of Christ should increase our interdependence on one another and our appreciation of the diversity of gifts within the body." 8
