From Persecutor to Apostle

- Saul Stays in Damascus: v.19b He spent some days with the disciples.
- Saul Preaches Christ: vv.20-22 That Jesus is the Son of God!
 - The verb rendered 'proved' (Gk. ovußißá(w) means literally 'placing together' here placing the OT promises alongside their fulfilment and hence 'proving' that Jesus was the one to whom they pointed. (cf. 17:2-3; 18:28; 26:22-23)."
- Saul The Persecutor Is Now An Apostle: See 1 Timothy 1:12-17

"The Damascus Road Experience"

A Persecutor Encounters Jesus!

- A dramatic life-changing story that is one-of-a-kind!
- It is recorded by Luke three times in the Book of Acts (Acts 9:1-19; 22:3-21; 26:4-23).

The Context of Acts 9 – Persecution, Threats & Murder!

- ▲ Acts 8:1-4 The Early Setting of the Persecution.
- ▲ Acts 9:1-2 Saul is Still Breathing Threats and Murder!
 - Note Acts 26:10-11 Saul cast his vote for Christians' executions!
 - He acquired letters of authority to arrest those who were of the Way (See John 14:6; Acts 19:9, 23; 22:4; 24:14, 22; 18:25-26).

The Damascus Road Experience

- ★ Acts 9:3-4 Saul encounters a blinding light from heaven and a voice speaking to him.
 - ⋄ v.4b "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?"



- Saul Responds: v.5 "Who are You, Lord?"
- <u>▼ Jesus Replies</u>: v.6a "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. It is had for you to kick against the goads."




- ★ The Lord Instructs Saul: v.6b "Arise and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do."
 - Acts 26:16-18 Contains a fuller account of what Jesus said.
 - This was a divine commission by Jesus Christ Himself (Gal. 1:1, 11-12, 16).
- Saul's Companions: v.7 Scared speechless! (See also Acts 22:9)
- ★ Saul is Blinded: vv.8-9 "Then Saul arose from the ground, and when his eyes were opened he saw no one... and was three days without sight, and neither ate nor drank."



See also Acts 26:11 and Acts 9:18!

The Divine Assignment of Ananias

- <u>♥ Divine Assignments</u>: God often works on two people simultaneously!
- **▼** God's Messenger: vv.10-11 God calls to Ananias in a vision.
 - ¹¹ "Arise and go to the street called Straight, and inquire at the house of Judas for one called Saul of Tarsus, for behold, he is praying. ¹² And in a vision he has seen a man named Ananias coming in and putting his hand on him, so that he might receive his sight."
- ★ Ananias is Apprehensive: vv.13-14 He had heard of Saul's persecution!
- ₩ God's Divine Assurance: vv.15-16 Saul is a chosen vessel of God.
- Ananias Visits Saul: vv.17-19 "Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you came, has sent me that you may receive your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit."



🤝 v.19a – Saul is baptized in water & the Spirit!

- 1) How would you have felt if you had been Ananias and required to go to Saul and speak to him about Jesus? (Acts 9:10-16)
- 2) What has been your "most difficult assignment" given to you by the Lord in terms of sharing your faith with someone?
- 3) Why is our obedience to God's sending so critical to the plan of God?
- 4) What kind of relationship do you think Saul and Ananias had after this encounter with one another?
