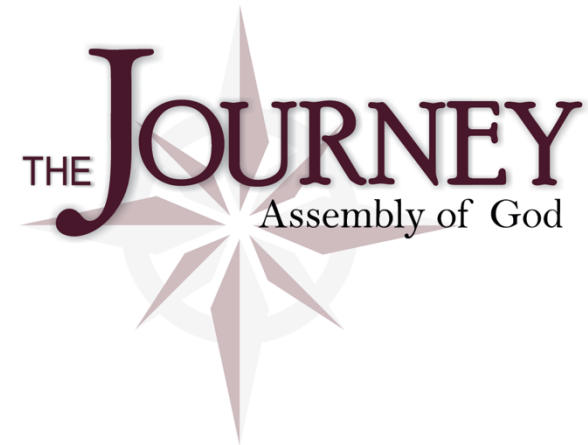


WE ARE CALLED TO SACRIFICE OURSELVES PEACEFULLY TO GOD

THE SACRIFICES OF CHRIST

- ✧ The Burnt Offering – Focuses on Surrender.
- ✧ The Meal / Grain Offering – Focuses on Service.
- ✧ The Peace / Fellowship Offering – Focuses on Sacrifice.

"NOTHING COMES FREE IN LIFE!"

- ✧ Everything Has A Cost... (Freedom / Salvation)
- ✧ The Principle of Sacrifice is at the Heart of the Peace Offering: Jesus was willing to make this sacrifice in order to bring redemption and a restored relationship (communion / fellowship) between God and mankind!

- ✧ Leviticus 3:1-17 – The Peace / Fellowship Offering
- ✧ Leviticus 7:11-34 – The Law of the Peace / Fellowship Offering

THE CONCEPT OF SACRIFICE IN THE PEACE / FELLOWSHIP OFFERING

- ✧ Peace Comes At A Cost!
- ✧ In order for there to be peace between God and man – a sacrifice had to be brought as a peace offering. [God is the Benefactor / Man is seeking reconciliation & restoration of his relationship with God.]
- ✧ There are three subcategories of the peace / fellowship offering...
 - 1) A Thanksgiving Offering (confession / acknowledgement).
 - 2) A Votive (vow) Offering (keeping a promise to God).
 - 3) A Freewill Offering (devotion / thankfulness). ¹



JESUS CHRIST IS OUR PEACE / FELLOWSHIP OFFERING

- ✧ At His First Coming Peace Was Proclaimed! (Luke 2:14)
- ✧ Scriptures: Romans 5:1-2, 5-8; Ephesians 2:14-18; Colossians 1:19-22.
 - 1) Peace between God and man!
 - 2) Peace between Jew and Gentile!
 - 3) Peace between Man and his conscience!
- ✧ It's all about "communion" with God! [Exodus 29:45; Leviticus 25:11-12; Jeremiah 31:33; 32:38; Ezekiel 37:26-27; Zechariah 8:8; 2 Corinthians 6:16-18]





✧ MY NEXT STEPS TODAY...

- ☐ **Contemplate The Nature of Sacrifice** ~ “Nothing comes as free in life.” How am I showing appreciation for what Jesus did for me on the cross of Calvary to restore my relationship with God?
- ☐ **Respond To The Invitation of Fellowship With God** ~ By surrendering my life to Jesus and receiving His forgiveness for my sins so that I can walk in daily fellowship with God.
- ☐ **Celebrate The Fellowship Jesus Made Possible** ~ His peace offering brings restoration, fullness of joy, a new-found reason for living and an opportunity for a developing relationship with God that's worth celebrating!
- ☐ **Offer My Life As A Living Sacrifice God God** ~ Through worship & praise, thanksgiving to God, doing good to others and sharing with those in need, walking in humility, being transformed by the Holy Spirit and God's Word, and allowing the fruit of the Spirit to be formed in me!

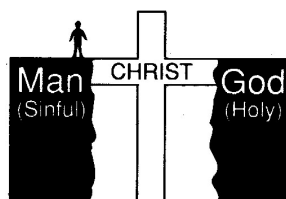
THE SACRIFICES OF CHRIST
