CONNECTION

- [1] After hearing today's message about the Bible, how would you respond to someone saying "I don't believe the Bible, its full of contradictions"?

OBSERVATION & INTERPRETATION

- [2] How should we approach an apparent "contradiction" in scripture?
- [3] Why is it important to understand the Biblical authors' writing style, use of language, concerns and culture before jumping to the conclusion that there is a contradiction?
- [4] Do you think our attitude towards the authority of Scripture and God's place in our life might make a difference in how we view Scripture? What are your thoughts on this?



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APPLICATION

- [5] Many people own a Bible but seldom read it. What do you think is creating this contradiction? Any solutions come to mind?

- [6] What might be the spiritual impact on your life if you prayerfully read the Bible cover to cover while taking notes on things that stand out to you?

- [7] How does reading the Bible through the lens of “His” [Jesus] story help you to understand the Bible better?

- [8] What does it mean to stop reading the “do’s” and to start reading the “who’s”? How does this impact your desire to read the Bible?

TAKING IT HOME

One way to get connected to Jesus the living Word is to prayerfully read the written word—both bring us into the grace and truth that nurtures and transforms our lives. Try reading a few chapters each day (give yourself grace if you miss a day) as outlined by pastor Rich and then in three month intervals write down how your thinking, attitudes, behaviors, life circumstances, and connection to God have changed over that period of time.



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
