CONNECTION

- [1] If you could be any super hero, which one would you be? What personal qualities or powers attract you to this super hero?

OBSERVATION & INTERPRETATION

- [2] In our culture today, how are people striving for power? To what end?

- [3] What does Matthew 28:18, Colossians 1:13, Revelation 1:18, Revelation 19:11-16, and 1 Corinthians 15:22-26 teach us about Jesus as a “super hero”?



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APPLICATION

- [4] In commenting on the captain of the Lord's army (Joshua 5:13-15), Pastor Rich pointed out that he didn't take sides, he just took over. How would this apply to Jesus entering into our personal, national, and world situations?
- [5] When Jesus is our Lord and Savior he frees us from our sin, empowers us with the Holy Spirit, and gives us purpose for our lives. How might we use this freedom, power, and purpose to battle along side of Captain Jesus as he builds his kingdom and defeats works of darkness?
- [6] Many super heroes have a weakness: Ironman (Tony Stark) is often arrogant, struggles with alcohol, and needs to keep his armored suit charged up while Captain America has normal human vulnerabilities even though he has super strength. What have you learned from today's message that can help you overcome your weakness (baggage)?

REFLECTION

- [7] Each super hero brought unique gifts and talents that made them indispensable to the Avengers Team and their mission to protect and make the world a better place. How might you use your gifts and talents with Team Jesus as you make him the captain of your life?



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
