



LifeGroup Discussion Guide
for the week of 1/28/2018

CONNECTION

- [1] Pastor Bill talked about how part of our legacy is what we imprint on others. Whenever we spend a lot of time with someone, a lot of times their attributes, characteristics and mannerisms can rub off on us. When was a time you noticed that you were doing something a friend, spouse, parent or sibling always did?

OBSERVATION & INTERPRETATION

- [2] Read Acts 11:19-26. Reflect on Pastor Bill's messages key points, how do these line up with what we see happening in this passage?
- [3] In verse 26 we see for the first time the disciples were called "Christians" which means "little Christ." I believe it is because of they were living the legacy of Christ. What do these verses teach us about what it might look like to live out the legacy of Christ?

(heres a hint pay close attention to verses 21, 23, 24 & 26.)

APPLICATION

[4] Pastor Bill talked about “Prevenient Grace,” meaning “grace got there first.” As we look at our own challenges of life, how does knowing the grace of God got their first change how we face our circumstances, pray and even operate when we arrive? What about just our daily situations? How does his prevenient grace strengthen our faith?

[5] This weekend Pastor Bill shared that in 2 Kings 4 Elisha did something he had never done and a child came back from the dead. In Acts 11:19-26 the disciples went to a new group of people and the message of grace changed the identity of the disciples. How does keeping the same message but delivering it in a new way, bring glory back to God? What are ways we can love our neighbors and communities in a new way with the same message of grace?

[6] How does the vision of legacy change how we treat others? If I am to be a “little Christ” how might my actions speak to the legacy of Christ? What can we do today to live out the legacy of Christ and how might that change the lives of those around us?

REFLECTION

[7] We know God’s grace is big enough for each of us. No matter what your legacy has been to date, ask God for a fresh revelation of his grace and to give you a new legacy, a greater legacy. Reflect on your relationships and ask God for the wisdom to leave a great legacy in the life of those around you.



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
